THE CITY A REPROACH

Chicago Chronicle Tell Why That City Is Worst In World

Chicago Chronicle: There is no secret, certainly that Chicago has a bad name. If its people could read the charges that come to a newspaper office they would realize that the matter had gone too far for concealment. This great city is a by-word and a reproach, not only throughout this country, but throughout the world. This bad name

is founded in part, of course, on its dirty streets, its inefficient police department, its feeble and slipshod city government, its execrable street car service and its mismanaged finances, but these are not all nor the worst of the things that have injured its reputation. What damns it in the eyes of all the world is its appalling lawlessness. Perhaps there is not another city in the civilized world in which the people from the mayor down have such a contempt for the laws and ordinances. Nearly all of this disorder is traceable to the labor unions and their incessant strikes, and to the indirect support afforded them for political reasons, by the mayor and police department. Nearly all that people at a distance read about Chicago is a record of its labor riots, the murders that have been committed in connection with them and the obsequies and ser-

vile manner in which the mayor negotiates and counsels with his outlaw constituents. The result is that the traveling public is really afraid to come here, custom is driven away from the merchants, and manufacturers have withdrawn from the city. Our bad name is not a sentimental injury. It has lowered the price of real estate and reduced the volume of business. DISCREPANCIES STILL EXIST

City Treasurer's Accounts Again Overhauled by the Special Investigating Committee of the City Council

Further Shortages and Inconsistencies Revealed as Between the Accounts of the City Treasurer and the Bank

Referred to the Ways and Means Committee to Complete Investigation and Bring About a Settlement of the Discrepancies

At the regular meeting of the city council last evening the following statement was made by the special committee relative to the status of the city treasurer's accounts for the past two terms:

Salem, Oregon, June 6, 1905.
To the Hon. Mayor and Common Council of the City of Salem, Oregon:
We, your special committee appointed by the Common Council to investigate the financial condition and receipts and disbursements of the City from January 1, 1898, to January 1, 1904, and your committee having on May 17, 1904, filed a report thereof, and said report having been referred back to your committee for further investigation, and after having again compared our work with the several conflicting reports, beg leave to file this our supplemental report.
We have been unable to harmonize the different reports made by the city treasurer from 1899 to 1904 and we herewith submit for your consideration summaries of such reports, viz:
