

Talked to the Native Sons.

The annual address by Hon. Walter L. Tooze, of Woodburn, was delivered in the forenoon instead of the afternoon, as announced. This change was made necessary in order to allow Mr. Tooze to return home in time to be present on Woodburn day (Saturday) at the Lewis and Clark Exposition, when he delivered the principal address. The address of Mr. Tooze is spoken of by all who heard it as the most eloquent, able and interesting ever delivered in the history of the Pioneers' organization. The silver-tongued young orator from French Prairie simply delighted the throng of people who pressed forward to hear him. Mr. Tooze's ability as an orator is known throughout the length and breadth of the state and extends even to our sister states. His oratory, his fine voice and his splendid delivery won the admiration of all. He was frequently interrupted by applause and when he concluded his address was the recipient of hearty congratulations by hundreds of his hearers.

The speaker took up the struggles of the pioneers—the foundation builders of this grand Oregon commonwealth—and drew a vivid picture of their trials and hardships and their pleasures. He brought his audience down the winding pathway to the present time, told of the present with its great opportunities reaching out for the sons and daughters to enjoy—all made possible through the efforts of the pioneers who blazed the trail, suffered the torments of the desert and experienced the isolation of the first settlers. He painted a glowing picture of the future, which is entrusted to the hands of the sons and daughters, and told of the wonders of the land of Oregon.

Mr. Tooze is a prominent candidate for congressman from this district. He is a merchant and postmaster at Woodburn, and also chairman of the first district Republican congressional committee. He has been prominent in political, fraternal and educational matters and in the development of the state for many years.
