CASE MAY BECOME FAMOUS

School Teacher Claims a Constitutional Right to Bat the Kids

A disagreement which recently took place between two women in the Goldberg school district, east of the city, has fair to become a celebrated case, involving the right to free speech, and it may be fought through the courts before the matter is settled.

Miss Adele Bare is one of the teachers in the Goldberg school. On the morning of May 31st last she punished a boy, R. Tinnin, and five other youngsters for some infraction of the rules of the school. During the afternoon recess the Tinnin boy went home and told his mother what had happened and the mother hurried off to the school house to interview the teacher.

According to the story of the interview told by the teacher there was quite a stormy time. Mrs. Tinnin wanted to talk the matter over and was invited into the library, where, it is claimed, the mother at once began talking angrily to Miss Bare, telling her she had done something to her son which she had never done herself. It is alleged that Mrs. Tinnin shook her fist in the teacher's face and threatened to kill her. It is also asserted that the angry mother struck the teacher in the face and then pulled her hair down.

It is claimed that Miss Summers, another teacher, heard the noise and went into Miss Bare's room, where she met the women.

A complaint was sworn to by the teacher and proceedings against Mrs. Tinnin commenced in Justice McCurdy's court in Satter township. The defense entered a demurrer to the complaint and it was sustained and the complaint was dismissed, in order, it was understood, to give the prosecution an opportunity to file an amended complaint. The new complaint has been filed.

Now, Mrs. Tinnin's attorney comes to the front with a demurrer to the amended complaint, holding that the dismissal of original complaint is a bar to further prosecution. He also claims that there was no offense, and says that Section 654 is in violation of the Constitutional provisions requiring general laws to be uniform in operation and prohibiting special laws to punish crimes and misdemeanors and special laws for the management of schools, and also as restraining all persons from free speech, or from writing or publishing their sentiments. It is held that it is in violation of the Constitution of the United States.—Salem Evening Bee.

PORTLAND GETTING AWAKE

Streets of Cairo Have Attempt at Murder and Suicide

As the result of a sensational attempt at murder and suicide on "The Streets of Cairo," on the Trail, at 9:30 o'clock Tuesday morning, Leon Brudo and his wife, Princess Rachide Siror are at St. Vincent's hospital. Dr. Kenneth A. J. Mackenzie, in attendance, believes the man will recover. The woman was not seriously injured.

The man is an Armenian merchant and his wife premier Moorish dancer at the Oriental theatre, in the Trail attraction, streets of Cairo. They quarreled because she is said to have paid too much attention to another man, and because she has refused to remarry her husband in American style. They were wedded in the old country in Oriental custom, and he is not now satisfied with that marriage.

Brudo was very angry at seeing his wife talking in a friendly manner with a Frenchman at a coffee-house in the grounds, and an all-night quarrel followed. At 9:30 o'clock Brudo lost control of himself and fired two shots at his wife, both bullets taking effect in the back. She ran from the house screaming, and immediately the crazed husband turned the weapon and shot himself through the face.

Captain Murphy, officer of the day for the exposition guards, and other soldiers were soon present, and took charge of the man and woman. They were removed to the emergency hospital, where temporary surgical attention was given. Later they were conveyed to St. Vincent's hospital.

Although it was early in the day, large crowds were present and the affair created a great sensation. Brudo will be arrested, if he recovers, and will face a charge of attempted murder.

Three of a Kind.

The visit of Dr. Harry Lane, mayor-elect of Portland, to this city, brought to light the fact that he, in company with Mayor C. A. Johns and Dr. O. M. Dodson, of this city, were old acquaintances, having formerly attended school together. "It was in the early seventies," said Dr. Lane to a group of interested listeners, as he sat in the lobby of the Geiser Grand yesterday "that Johns, Dodson and myself first met. We were all three attending the Willamette University in Salem at the time. Dodson and myself had entered the medical department of the school, while Mr. Johns was taking a literary course in preparation for the practice of law and many were the good times we enjoyed, playing jokes and enjoying all those harmless pranks that students delight in, and this meeting with them here today and renewing our old friendship is a pleasure that I have not experienced in a long while. In our classes we were each a year apart. I graduated in '76, Dodson in '77, and Johns finished his course there in '78."

At this moment dinner was announced, and the party broke up to adjourn to the dining room, where the banquet awaited them.—Baker City Herald.

SWEDEN'S TROUBLES

Stockholm, June 21.—When the Riksdag assembled today in extraordinary session to consider the dissolution of the union by Norway, the government immediately introduced a bill asking authorization to enter into negotiations with the Norwegian Storting for a conditional settlement of the questions involved in the separation of the heretofore dual kingdom. Premier Ramstedt recommended a pacific settlement. The premier declared negotiations were necessary to definitely clear up the situation. Several members concurred in the premier's views. The king then addressed the assembly and said he had acted according to his conscience always, with a full desire for the welfare of the two peoples.
