HART AND ROOT.

To Battle for the Heavyweight Championship.

Ross, Nev., July 3.—Marvin Hart, of Louisville, who aspires to succeed to Antonio's championship title, and Jack Root, the Chicago heavyweight, who also owns a similar ambition, have completed their work of preparation and are ready for the going to call them into the ring to engage in a finish fight to settle the question of their relative supremacy. James J. Jeffries is on hand to act as referee. An arena has been specially constructed for the battle, with a seating capacity of 6000. Many sporting men are arriving from out of town, and from present indications seats at the ringside will be at a premium.

Reports today from their respective training quarters are to the effect that both Root and Hart are in first-class condition, and fit to engage in the battle of their lives.

The day dawned bright and clear with indications of very high temperature this afternoon. The refusal of Root's request to place a covering over the ring seems to be worrying the Chicagoans, and the impression is growing that the heat will have as much to do in determining the result as anything else Jeffries' plain talk regarding the possibility of crooked work stimulated the betting, which is, however, still light, Hart being a slight favorite.

About 4000 people are at the ringside, among them a liberal sprinkling of women. Root's weight is given as 170 and Hart's 190. Hart won the toss for corners, and took the corner with his back to the sun.

STREET MEETING POSTPONED

One of the street committees is out of town, and it has been decided to postpone the meeting this evening to hear objections to the bids on South Commercial street. It is understood some are not satisfied with the bids that have been made, and want the council to reject them all, and ask for new bids.

It is not likely that any bid made would ever be acceptable to all the property owners. The idea is advanced by some that they could build their part of the street themselves, but it is doubtful that they could comply with the specifications, which require the use of a 50-ton roller, and a guarantee that the work is up to a certain standard of durability.

The improvement of South Commercial street has been planned as carefully as the finest hitherto pavement, so far as putting down first-class work. It will be graded, tamped, rolled and the layer of macadam put down as good as the heaviest machinery can do it, under the most careful supervision and the most carefully drawn specifications.

If the best bid made is out of reach of the property owners the improvement will have to be abandoned, and some other street taken up and put through. It is understood that Liberty and High street people are preparing to set, and take up macadam pavement as soon as the city can get ready to act. It seems too good to be true, and no one will believe that South Commercial street will be improved until the work is actually being done. In the meantime, if there is anything wrong with the bid it should be shown up.
