## STREET MEETING POSPONED

One of the street committee is out of town, and it has been decided to not hold a meeting this evening to hear objections to the bids on South Commercial street. It is understood some are not satisfied with the bids that have been made, and want the council to reject them all, and ask for new bids.

It is not likely that any bid made would ever be acceptable to all the property owners. The idea is advanced by some that they could build their part of the street themselves, but it is doubtful that they could comply with the specifications, which require the use of a 50-ton roller, and a guarantee that the work is up to a certain standard of durability.

The improvement of South Commercial street has been planned as carefully as the finest bituminous pavement, so far as putting down first-class work. It will be graded, tamped, rolled and the layer of macadam put down as good as the heaviest machinery can do it, under the most careful supervision and the most carefully drawn specifications.

If the best bid made is out of reach of the property owners the improvement will have to be abandoned, and some other street taken up and put through. It is understood that Liberty and High street people are preparing to act, and take up macadam pavement as soon as the city can get ready to act. It seems too good to be true, and no one will believe that South Commercial street will be improved until the work is actually being done. In the meantime, if there is anything wrong with the bid it should be shown up.

## SIAM IS PROGRESSING

Hamilton King, United States Minister to Siam, arrived here yesterday on the steamer Manchuria, accompanied by Mrs. King, and during the few days they expect to remain in town before proceeding East they are guests at the Occidental.

"A Franco-Siamese treaty has just been concluded," said Mr. King yesterday, "and, as a result of the freedom from outside molestation which this assures her, Siam will now, for the first time, have an opportunity to show the world what she is capable of in the way of modern development. I have great faith in Siam's future. The country has for its ruler a gentleman of culture and refinement, and who possesses remarkable intelligence and a progressive spirit. He has for an adviser E. H. Strobel, professor of international law at Harvard, and Strobel has for an assistant Professor Westgaard, professor of law at Harvard. They make a strong team, and they have the implicit confidence of the government and the people.

"Siam is going ahead wonderfully. Bangkok, the capital, now has thirty or thirty-five miles of electric railways, seventy-five miles of paved streets, a complete electric-lighting system and many modern buildings. For years it occupied the unique position of being the only nation on the earth that had no national debt, but a few months ago it effected a foreign loan for the purpose of building railroads and other

Internal improvements. The country is rich in agricultural and mining resources. The entire southern part of the kingdom is an immense rice field, where the finest rice in the world is produced. The country is also rich in tin and precious metals. Although there has been little development thus far, Siam already produces 60 per cent of the world's supply of tin. Mining concessions are now being obtained by foreigners, and there will be great activities in that direction in the near future. J. W. Taylor, one time superintendent of schools in San Francisco, has just obtained a concession from the king and will arrive here from Siam very shortly to arrange for some extensive operations."—San Francisco Chronicle.

### DUNBAR IS SUSTAINED.

Supreme Court Endorses Attorney-General Crawford's Opinion—Other Decisions.

The supreme court today upheld the attorney-general and secretary of state, holding that the latter could not issue warrants in payment of the salaries of the asylum employes, since there is no appropriation available for that purpose, and that the Kay law did not repeal or amend in any manner the former law.

There were eight other opinions, as follows:

State of Oregon against George S. Miller, reversed and new trial ordered.  
P. F. Fouts against City of Hood River, affirmed. Fouts got decision in lower court.

State of Oregon, ex rel, against County Court of Malheur County, affirmed. County court got decision in the court below.

John A. Tucker against S. Ottenheimer estate, affirmed. The estate got the decision in the court below.

Moses Taylor against Isabella Taylor, affirmed. Moses got the decision in the court below.

Chas. McGary and wife against G. W. Biggers, affirmed. Biggers got the decision in the court below.

Little E. Rice against Wallowa County, affirmed. Mrs. Rice got the decision in the court below.

O. R. & N. Co. against Umatilla County, affirmed. The county got the decision in the court below.

The court also denied rehearing two important cases. Neppie up O. & C. railroad and Violet up North Pacific Lumber Co.
