**STREET WORK DEFERRED**

**Council Receives Protest From South Commercial Street Residents—Action Deferred**

The matter of the improvement of South Commercial street and also action on the petition from the taxpayers' league were definitely postponed. An adjourned meeting of the city council will be held this evening, at 9 o'clock for the purpose of definitely arranging the matter of holding the special city election to determine whether or not the city shall construct the proposed concrete bridges, and bond the city to pay for the same.

A large amount of routine work was transacted, as follows: The committee on accounts and current expenses reported that they had examined certain bills which had been presented for current expenses, and recommended that they be ordered paid.

The committee on streets reported that they had called upon the secretary of the Taxpayers' league in regard to a petition which that body had submitted to the council asking for permission to improve certain streets, and that it had found that there was no list of members of that league, as the city ordinance required, and hence no action could be taken until a petition was presented, signed by a certain percentage of the abutting property owners of the streets in question.

The bid of the Warren Construction company of Portland for the improvement of South Commercial street was declared to be a reasonable bid by the committee to which the bids were referred, and the committee recommended that a contract be entered into with that company for the proposed improvement. Before the report was adopted Alderman Bayne presents a petition from property owners along South Commercial street, protesting against the proposed improve-

ment of that street. The petition was referred to the street committee.

On motion of Hughes, the street committee was ordered to investigate the condition of the spring at the intersection of Cottage and Bellevue streets.

The committee on public buildings reported that it had engaged a carpenter to look at the building on State street to estimate the cost of repairing the same. On motion of Alderman Stenloff the committee was instructed to secure tenants for the building and report the result at the next regular meeting of the council.

The committee on fire and water reported that W. S. Beckner had petitioned for permission to put a new roof on the kitchen to his dwelling on High street, and on motion of Alderman Hughes it was granted.

Committee on health and police recommended that all officers of the city be given a 10 days leave of absence at some time during the summer, and this motion was made and carried.

The report of Street Commissioner Kurtz for June was read and referred to the street committee. Report of city recorder was also read and referred to the committee.

The property owners of block presented a petition, in which they represented that there was no public sewer through the said block, and asking that a sewer be put in.

An ordinance was introduced by Alderman Acheson specifying that in future all sidewalks that were built within certain limits should be constructed of cement. The bill was read the first and second time and referred to the committee on ordinances.

The ordinance providing for the impounding of animals running at large in the city, and preventing such nuisances was read the third time and passed without a dissenting vote.

The ordinance providing for the calling of a special election to submit to the electors of the city the proposition of bonding the city in the sum of \$35,000 for the purpose of building seven concrete bridges within the city, came up for third reading, but was referred back to the committee on ordinance. The council then adjourned to meet this evening at 8 o'clock to further take up this matter.

Upon motion of Alderman Hughes the city attorney was instructed to attend all meetings of the city council.

The ordinance declaring it a nuisance to tether cows in or upon public streets, paths, alleys and parks within the city was read the third time and passed without objection.

Upon motion of Alderman Bayne, the committee on ways and means was ordered to prepare for publication a statement of the financial condition of the city, and report at the next meeting.
