A large amount of routine work was ransacted, as follows:

The committee on accounts and curent expenses reported that they had xamined certain bills which had been presented for current expenses, and ecommended that they be ordered

The committee on streets reported hat they had called upon the secreary of the Taxpayers' league in regard to a petition which that body had submitted to the council asking for and that it had found that there was to the committee on ordinances. so list of members of that league, as he city ordinance required, and hence so action could be taken until a petition was presented, signed by a certain percentage of the abutting property owners of the streets in question. The bid of the Warren Construction company of Portland for the improvement of South Commercial street vas declared to be a reasonable bid y the committee to which the bids vere referred, and the committee recmmended that a contract be entered nto with that company for the proosed improvement. Before the report was adopted Alderman Bayne preents a petition from property owners along South Commercial street, proesting against the proposed improve
