A Marshfield Love Letter.

(Coast Mail.) To the Hon. Mayor and Common Council of the City of Marshfield, Or.: Gentlemen: I respectfully ask you for an order directing and requiring the present city marshal, J. W. Carter, to refrain from interfering with me. I further say that said J. W. Carter is, as I believe, endeavoring to put up some kind of a job or enter into a conspiracy with certain enemies of my husband and myself, so as to find some pretext by which he can arrest or have me arrested, and sent to prison or some asylum, that he is so prejudiced against me that he will attempt to arrest me without any cause whatever. I believe that he will, unless directed by you to refrain from so doing, arrest me and put me in prison at first opportunity without any cause. I am informed and believe that on July 7, 1905, when he arrested my

husband, or within a few minutes later had four or five men at the foot of the hallway at my residence so as to arrest me, and had not some of my friends been near the said Carter would have arrested me, and put me in the city jail without any cause whatever.
