A stout clamor went up today for Depew's resignation from the Yale corporation. It is practically certain that, if he does not resign, he will fail of re-election next year. The prevailing sentiment in the matter is voiced tonight in the following editorial in the New Haven Evening Reg-

"Every Yale man feels the discredit of Depew's behavior, for repeatedly they have elected him to the corporation and cheered him when misunderstanding him. His alma mater gave him the degree of doctor of laws. When his term expires next year, unless ne voluntarily retires, it will be neeessary to remove him from the board of control. He should begin new to plan for an escape from that humiliation. "
