This she can do singlehanded, but when she gathers in a herd—well, then it is all the same as a dark brown epidemic, everybody gets it, and it goes through a community, leaving a swath of broken hearts and sighing bachelors as plainly visible and as sad to look upon as the faces of those who are just let out of a town quarantined for smallpox. Individually, she is irresistible; collectively, she is a cyclone, a besom of destruction to the peace of bachelordom, a Johnstown flood, a Galveston tidal wave, a Mt. Pelee explosion, a Republican landslide, an exposition address of welcome, an Oregonian editorial, or any other deadly thing. We all like her singly and collectively,

and we send our kids to her when we can't control them ourselves, and she winds them around her fingers, and hypnotizes them, and sends them home to us a hundred per cent better every day for having been in her company. And in return she gets paid about one half what she ought to get and one tenth of what she earns, and she puts up with it, and turns last year's dress, and economizes, and fights the battle of life bravely, and if there are tears in her heart only she and the good God know it, and neither of them ever tell. She is altogether lovely, a pearl without price; a patient, faithful, delicious bit of true womanhood—and, dog gone her, we all like her, we all like her, anyhow.
