## FIFTY YEARS OPEN

### Sault Ste Marie, Mich., Celebrates the Anniversary of Opening the Canal

Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., Aug. 2.—This entire vicinity is in fee today in celebration of the semi-centennial of the opening of St. Mary's ship canal, which made possible through-water communication between Lake Superior and the lower lakes and the Atlantic seaboard.

Preparations for the celebration, which is to continue over tomorrow, have been in progress for nearly a year. Substantial appropriations were made by the federal government and the state of Michigan, together with the maritime interests of the great lakes. The two-days' programme includes historical exercises, marine spectacles and an elaborate pyrotechnic display. Visitors are here from all the states and Canadian provinces bordering on the great lakes and among the chief participants are many notable representatives of the two governments.

Completed by Michigan in 1855, the "Soo" canal was transferred to the United States government in 1870, has been widened and deepened several times and is now immeasurably the busiest of all the world's artificial waterways. The traffic by way of the "Soo" canals, American and Canadian, for the seven and a half months of last year, in which the ice was absent and they were open to navigation, was 32,000,000 net tons, 27,000,000 of which was through the American canal.

The "Soo" canal has had industrial and sociological consequences for the country beyond calculation. By opening through-water communication between Lake Superior and the lower lakes and the Atlantic seaboard, by way of the Erie canal and the Hudson it has developed the vast mineral wealth of the Lake Superior region, has furnished a cheap and convenient outlet for the transportation of grain, flour and other products to the East and to Europe, has helped to build up great industrial centers at Chicago, Duluth, Cleveland and other points, and has contributed materially toward giving the United States its primacy in the production of iron, steel and copper.
