been puzzling the best of them, but since the cause has been discovered it is very plain to all. It seems that there has been an unusual activity in logging for the past two weeks, and at present there are hundreds of logs stranded along the bars, shores and islands of the river about Salem. Just below the bridge there is a large float of them lodged at the head of the gravel bar, and it is now plain that these logs, while they have not made a "jam" have had the effect to dam the current enough to cause a raise of several inches above what it would be under normal conditions.

The Willamette is practically at low water, but there is heavy river traffic between here and Portland, where boats are making regular trips. There has seldom been as heavy logging operations on the upper river as at present, all of which bodes well for the entire valley, as the lumber and milling business is a good index to the prosperity

of the surrounding country.

The water in the slough, just above Mill creek, is so low that the Capital Improvement Company have constructed a veritable pontoon bridge across to its sand spit on the island. Instead of hauling the sand across on the big barge that craft has been anchored in the middle of the slough, and a smaller

pontoon has been constructed at either end of the same, which are attached to the aprons at either end. With this contrivance the teams drive across with their loads and save considerable time. The bridge is proving a great convenience to the company, as well as the neighbors, who use it for passing back and forth.
