GOVERNOR VISITS SOUTHWEST

Sees His Constituents in the Coos and Curry Country

Governor Chamberlain returned this morning from a week spent in the portions of Coos and Curry county, portions of this commonwealth he had not previously visited. His promise to go through every county in the state before he retires from his first term is being faithfully kept, and he spent a very eventful and strenuous week in the two southwestern counties. He took a steamer to North Bend, visited Marshfield, Coquille, Myrtle Point, Langlois, Bandon and other places, speaking to the people of all the towns, and receiving quite an ovation from sections that gave majorities for the Hon. Wm. J. Furnish, the machine nominee for the office to which Chamberlain was elected. The governor is loud in his praises of the magnificent resources of the country he went through. He praises the harbors in which he was carried through fog and darkness with perfect safety, and without tug or pilot. He talked development of the country and assured the people, without regard to party lines, that, as chief executive, he sympathized with every legitimate effort to build up the country, and make Western Oregon blossom like the rose. The Republicans had better not put up a "stiff" for governor, if they expect to elect him.

A. Seaborg, a fisherman, and John Edwards, his boatpuller, were arrested by Sheriff Linville at Astoria last night on the charge of stealing about 800 pounds of salmon from the T. Lindenberg cold storage plant. Edwards has confessed to the sheriff and district attorney. He says they sold about 400 pounds of fish last night to Lindenberg, and before leaving the building stole the fish they had sold, and about as much more. They then sold the fish again to the Tallant-Grant cannery.

WORSE THAN POLITICS

Portland Visited By a Bug That Outsmells Even City Griffs

Nomus pygmaeus, known in the vernacular as the "stinkbug," is "with us again." He arrived in Portland last week, and has made his presence known in the same old way. His smell is as strong as ever, and thus the recollections of last year have been revived and strongly added to. Complaints were heard occasionally last week, but today these became so unmistakable that a little investigation brought out the fact that what the scientists call the malodorous carabid, nomus pygmaeus, and about which lengthy and learned papers have been written and read, has paid Portland his second visitation within recent years. He is not quite so numerous as was the case last year, but his foetid odor is as pungent and nauseous as ever.

He has made himself conspicuous in the circumambient atmosphere in several places. Saturday he dropped into the box office of the Star theatre and almost put the cashier to route. Two of the bugs called at Woodward & Clarke's drug store and attracted considerable attention. The business office of the Telegram was invaded for two days, and one who visited the Oaks yesterday testifies that the bug was in evidence there, having his smell with him.

Size Small, but Smell Large.

The stinkbug is of the insectivorous beetle branch of bugdom. He is not more than a quarter of an inch in

length, and in this respect is out of all proportion to his smell. He looks much like a cockroach or a June bug, although not so large. His odor is generally admitted to be a secretion, similar in point of nature with that of the skunk and other insects and animals which emit foul-smelling odors as a means of defense. The stinkbug throws out his weapon of defense only when disturbed and made angry.

The first appearance of the bug in Portland, of which there is any record for several years was last summer.

Frank A. Heitkemper's son discovered one in the former's jewelry store, on Morrison street. It was believed there, as in many other places, that a rat had departed this life and was dissolving into his ingredient elements, and it was not until the discovery of the real malefactor himself that the rat theory was exploded, and the blame placed where it belonged.

The bug can emit a smell that pervades an entire room, and instances are on record where it has rendered boarding houses uninhabitable. It is active in dry weather. The bug is supposed to pass the larval stage in swamps. Mr. Woodward says that its odor can be destroyed by formaldehyde, with the use of a small lamp, which generates gas. It may be captured by placing a piece of tainted meat on sticky fly paper.

Migratory Tax Law Unconstitutional.

Because it is in violation of that section of the constitution which requires that all taxation shall be equal and uniform, the supreme court Monday morning, in an opinion of which Chief Justice Wolverton is author, declares that the migratory livestock law passed by the legislature is void. The opinion was given in the case of Lake county, appellant, vs. A. B. Schroeder, respondent, from Lake county, and the judgment rendered by Judge H. L. Benson is affirmed.
