## ARISTOCRATS HANG ON

St. Petersburg, Aug. 14.—A hopeful tone concerning the discussion continues, due to a series of optimistic telegrams from Witte. In an official note published today is reference to the proposed national assembly on which the hopes of all Russia is centered. The significant words "the supreme autocracy of the powers" are used for the express purpose of finally removing from the minds of the liberals the idea that the fundamental law of the supremacy of the autocracy is to be abandoned.

## The Situation in New Orleans.

New Orleans, Aug. 14.—The important question of whether or not suspicious cases of fever should be reported has been settled by Dr. White, who has instructed that 11 cases be reported. So far the street number has not been published. Shreveport is now free from fever. Dr. Guiteras says there will never be any more yellow fever in New Orleans after the present trouble. Cleaning will be continued. There are some new cases in the parishes surrounding the city. Eight cases are reported on the Reserve plantation, with one death, and one or more suspicious cases at Bon Ami. The case Tallulah has been pronounced positive, and three more cases are reported from Patterson.
