

INFECTED FRUIT SEIZED

Marion County Fruit Inspector Armstrong is Doing His Duty

Within the last week, Mr. Armstrong has seized several small lots of fruit infected with San Jose scale, and placed on the Salem market. The fruit seized consisted of pears and apples, some of which were destroyed and part returned to the grower. The law prohibiting the sale of infected fruit is very stringent, and Mr. Armstrong proposes to see that it is enforced. Most of the Salem groccymen are very kind, and are co-operating with the inspector, but a few are causing a great deal of trouble. The inspector has power to seize all infected fruit that is offered for sale, and he will surely do so. If persons persist in trying to sell the fruit, after they have been warned not to do so, they may be fined or imprisoned.

All of the fruit seized was raised in or near Salem. Mr. Armstrong stated that the old trees in the city were the worst infected of any in the county, and he anticipates his greatest trouble in this place when the work of cleaning out the orchard shall begin a little later.

The Oregon Will Run.

The Willamette river will this year not only break all records for low water, but come as near locking up river traffic as is possible. It is now one-tenth of a foot below low water, or that much lower than ever was known, and it is still falling. The tide is not apt to turn until late in October, and if the rains do not come earlier than usual, we may expect to see the river go a foot or more below the lowest record. This state of affairs has necessitated the Oregon Transportation Company pulling off the steamer Pomona, but their new steamer, the Oregon, can still carry a good load, and she will continue through the dry season, unless the water goes lower than is anticipated. This steamer will leave the dock at the usual hours, 7 o'clock a. m., on Mondays, Wednesdays and Thursdays, returning each alternate day.

For several days there has been a rumor that the Citizens' Light & Traction Company had disposed of its properties to the Oregon City Company. This morning shows there was foundation for the rumor of sale, though it was not correct as to the purchaser. The street car lines, power and light plant have been sold, the papers are all made out, and the transfer will be made September 10th. A New York company is the purchaser, and that the car lines will be extended is an assured fact. Indeed, it is probable the car lines will reach into the neighboring towns, and be transformed into an interurban system. Mr. Welch, manager, and one of the proprietors of the plant, could not be seen, as he is in Portland, and full particulars of the transfer could not be learned.
