The Maori girls did a pretty welcoming dance, singing and dancing slowly backward all the way till we got to the enclosure around the meeting house (whare punie), where the speeches were to be made.

After some time of this and the presentation of mats, etc., we were invited into the whare to lunch. It was laid most correctly on big tables with cloths but the menu consisted of roast duck, chicken, beef and sucking pig and, so it is said, potatoes, peas and kumara (sweet potatoes), cooked in a Maori oven.
