Foreign Notes of Interest.

The pilgrim Pepel, 105 years old, who arrived in Marseilles recently from Canada on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land, has just died in the public hospital in that city after a brief illness.

Paris possesses some 80,000 trees, without counting those in private parks and gardens, cemeteries, or schools. They are of many varieties. There are, in round figures, some 26,000 plane-trees; 16,000 elms, 17,000 chestnuts, 6,000 maples, 5,000 acacias, 4,000 oaks, and exactly 2,222 limes. There are very few willows; one hangs over the grave of Alfred de Musset.

A dispatch from Tangier states that the first use made by the sultan of Morocco of the money advanced to him by the German syndicate has been to spend \$30,000 of it on some celebrated Egyptian dancers, whom his Majesty intends to install in his palace at Fez.

The famous tapestries of the palace of Fontainebleau have been cut and slashed until they are almost in shreds, and the sculptures and carved wood mantelpieces have been chipped in scores of places. The damage, aside from that to the tapestries, is estimated at \$85,000.

William Finlay, late of the Life Guards, has been admitted to the Hackney infirmary suffering from consumption. A special bed had to be made for his accommodation, as his height is 6 feet 9½ inches, he for 12 years holding the distinction of being the tallest man in the British army.

There is a strong movement throughout Australia against importing locomotives from England or Australia, or even allowing private Australian firms to manufacture them. Sentiment favors the construction of locomotives in the state workshops instead of by private enterprise.

Notwithstanding that 80 per cent of the inhabitants of Russia are classified as illiterates, Maxim Gorky thinks the peasant and laboring classes more intelligent politically, and fitter to vote, than the upper classes.

The town of Kazard, Russia, boasts a huge water tank, into which all tramps and beggars are driven by the police and compelled to wash the moment they enter the town.

A profit of over \$5,000,000 on the fiscal year just concluded has been realized by the government-owned roads of Japan.
