Notice is hereby given that sealed bids will be received by the City of Salem at the office of the undersigned at the City Hall at Salem, Oregon, up to 10 o'clock a. m. of October 13th, 1905, for the construction of a six-inch sewer through the Charles Cartwright addition to the City of Salem; hence across Capitol street, and hence through lot No. 2, in block No. 3, in said City of Salem, Oregon, to connect with the alley sewer in said block No. 86, to be built in accordance with the plans and specifications hereof now on file in the office of the City Recorder.
