GOOD ROADS WORK

Convention at Corvallis Will Talk Earth Roads

The annual Good Roads convention at Corvallis will concentrate its program upon making better earth roads. Secretary H. B. Thielsen, of this city, is sending out bulletins on the operation of the King Split Log drag, showing how to make and operate it. County Judge Scott has sent out a bulletin and letter to each supervisor in this county. In his letter to good road workers, Secretary Thielsen says: "Following the line adopted at the last annual convention held in Salem in December, 1904, it has been decided to confine the discussion and papers, so far as practicable, to a single line, rather than to scatter over the various phases of the good roads question, and this time having in view the great preponderance of earth roads and the certainty that this proportion must continue, though perhaps in a diminishing degree, for many years, we will take up the subject of how best to build and maintain earth roads. It is believed that the discussion of this question will be of very great practical value to all who are practically connected in any manner with building and maintaining roads."
