**Two Miles of Cement Walks.**

Over two miles of cement walks have been laid in the city of Salem since Street Commissioner Kurtz took office the first of last January. This breaks the record for any similar time in the city's history. Cement walks, from being the exception in pavements, a few years ago, are fast becoming the rule. These walks laid this year are both inside and outside of the districts created by the city council wherein all new sidewalks that are put down must be of cement.

The great majority of the walks have been put down in the residence districts and have a width of five feet. Their cost averaged nine and ten cents a foot. Some walks, however, have been laid in the business section that are twelve feet wide the full distance from the property line to the curb.

Commissioner Kurtz is this week preparing his report to the council. Especially proud is he of the showing he can make of work done in improving the pavements of the city. Mr. Kurtz said this morning that property owners all over the city showed the greatest willingness to improve their property by the laying of costly and permanent walks. Though the commissioner is empowered, wherever property owners refuse to make required pavement improvements, this procedure has not been necessary in even a single case. In fact, the greatest majority of cases the improvement has been made without even a suggestion from the street commissioner.
