## Congress and Convention Was Successfully Concluded

### Recommends Changes in the System of Raising State Taxes

The McMinnville Farmers' Congress and Shippers' Convention was brought to a highly successful conclusion. Three sessions were held in the largest hall in the city, and a banquet, lasting until 2 o'clock in the morning, was given, and all were characterized by an attendance of the highest class, and speeches and proceedings of the greatest interest.

#### Boosting for Coos Bay.

The members of the delegation that came out from Coos Bay were made the guests of honor, and the whole convention resolved itself into a great big manifestation of good will and enthusiasm for that neglected section of the state. The gentlemen from Coos Bay declared that they were never treated as well anywhere as by the farmers and business men of Willamette valley, and ties of friendship were cemented that will last for many years to come, and will be an immense influence in the development of Western Oregon.

#### Politicians Were There.

Headed by Walter L. Toose, who, as a potato shipper and hop buyer, and general bull of the markets, there were a number of candidates on the program and all present were given a chance to toot their toot; and some good pointers for the people broke loose that will be useful hereafter. Toose as a congressional candidate showed his independence of Portland or railroad influences by boldly declaring for opening the coast harbors, and Dr. Withycombe sailed into the monopolized grain markets and throttled live stock markets. Governor Chamberlain, as chief executive, stood up for the interests of the whole state, and plead for harmony and co-operation.
