**PRINTS RAISED SYMBOLS**

**Blind School Has Machine Which Prints the Braille System of Dots**

A printing press for the blind has been received by, and is now in daily use at, the Oregon School for the Blind. This unique invention has been much needed to complete the institution's equipment for properly instructing the unfortunate pupils. Books for the blind, of which the institution hitherto has had but meager supply, can now be printed at a minimum of cost and as frequently as desired. The press, or metallic typewriter, for such a term more properly describes it, was received last week, and is the first ever brought to an Oregon institution. It was invented by Superintendent Hall, of the Illinois School for the Blind. It prints what is known as the Braille alphabet, which uses a combination of six dots, each combination representing a letter.

The press is made of solid cast steel. It has six keys, each of which, when pressed, causes a dot to fall into position, and these are forced through a sheet of zinc, making the letter or combination desired. After the zinc, which may be of varying size, is covered with the characters, it is taken out of the machine, a wet piece of prepared paper placed over it, another layer of sheet metal put on top of the paper, and the whole subjected to pressure. The paper, after the operation, is indented by the letters which had been punched in the zinc sheet. After the paper has thoroughly dried it is finished and is found to be covered with a mass of raised dots, arranged in characters, that represent letters and words.

Practice enables even one of the scholars of the institution to operate the machine with great rapidity, and while no one has yet attained a very high degree of proficiency, Superintendent Jones states that it is possible to work with the press almost as rapidly as a stenographer uses a typewriter.

The acquisition fills a greatly needed place at the blind school. The library can now be increased without great cost, for books can be printed by the pupils. Hitherto any addition to the library was secured in the East, at an expense of from \$2.00 a volume up to an indefinite sum, governed, of course, by the size of the book. School books of all sorts can also be printed with the machine.
