### A Railroad to Coos Bay.

The promise of the Harriman system to construct a railroad from Drains to Marshfield is taken very seriously by the press of the state.

It has been given a long editorial in the Oregonian, as a proposition that means so much to the development of the whole of Oregon.

The fact is the opening of another deep sea harbor on the west coast of Oregon sends a cold chill down the backs of pessimistic economists.

The construction of a railroad from Drains to Coos Bay via Scottsburg and Gardiner has a great many obstacles to overcome, and will take money.

So far as it is genuine and a real effort to meet the demands of the people for development it is to be accepted in good faith at present.

If the people of Oregon want railroad development they have to get down to the problem, just as good, level-headed businessmen anywhere.

The people of Oregon should back up the work of the development conventions, and they should not be diverted from their purpose to develop.

If it is a fact that the Harriman lines in Oregon have taken out seventeen million dollars in ten years, net profits, it means something.

Would it be an unfair proposition to have Mr. Harriman expend one-half of his net earnings in Oregon annually in new lines?

This writer does not know what would be right in this matter, but Oregon should not always be producing money to build railroads in other states.

Let all these matters be considered fairly and equitably, and let both the people of Oregon and the corporations deal justly with each other.

There is little doubt that some of the state and national banks ARE LOOSELY MANAGED IN WESTERN STATES.

The national bank examiners, appointed by the comptroller of the treasury, do not always find the leaks and weak spots.

A greater individual responsibility is thrown upon the state and private bankers in the absence of examiners.

It is to be regretted that there is not a state law requiring reports to be made public in such concerns.

The presence of a state law and a state banking commission does not always insure protection to the people.

Large banking interests have always opposed the enactment of state laws for the regulation and control of banks.

Then why should they oppose a state banking law and state bank examiner?

## COAL MINE ACCIDENTS

The total number of persons employed at mines and at the quarries in the United Kingdom and the Isle of Man during the year 1904, says the Engineering and Mining Journal, was 974,634, of whom 877,057 were employed in or about mines, and 97,577 in or about quarries. Of the 877,057 persons employed at mines, 698,967 worked underground and 178,090 above ground; of the latter, 5748 were females. Compared with the preceding year there is an increase of 4650 males working underground, and increase of 418 males and 100 females working above ground, making a total increase of 5168 persons. Ninety per cent of the increase occurred at coal mines. At iron ore and other mines, there was an increase of 559 males, and a decrease of 53 females.

There were 1017 accidents in and about mines and quarries, resulting in the loss of 1090 lives. In comparison with the figures for 1903 there is a decrease of 13 in the number of fatal accidents, and 7 in the number of lives lost. In coal mines 1017 separate fatal accidents, causing the loss of 1055 lives, were recorded, and 110 accidents causing the loss of 112 lives happened at quarries. There was an increase of 6 in the number of fatal accidents in metal mines, as compared with the returns for 1903.

The average death rate of underground workers in mines in 1904 was only 1.23 per 1000 miners employed. This is the lowest number ever recorded, and is an eloquent tribute to the wisdom of the government mine regulations and the efficiency of the supervising engineering staff.

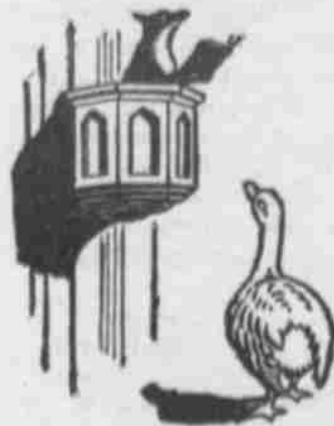
