"A few suggestions as to what can be done to reach far out toward the making of our city the city beautiful. the pride and joy of all our people,

'The first work that lies before us in the accomplishment of this good and accessary work of civic improvement is building good streets, laying permanent sidewalks, and parking the proposed wide boulevards between the walks and curbs in the residence parts of the city. "There seems to be no great difficulty

to get our people to lay down good cement walks from what we see going on in that good work all over the city, Then why not take up the street improvement work? If it is the matter of improving our wide streets that suggestions;

"Go on any of our streets outside of the business part of our city on which there is no street car line and see that

only about sixteen fet in the center of the street is used for traffic, and that the remainder between the curbs is givon up to grass weeds.
