ALL FOR OREGON.

In some localities the impression seems to prevail that the Willamette Development League is antagonistic to Portland, and that one of its objects was to fight Oregon's metropolis. Nothing could be farther from the league's intention. It was organized and exists, not for the purpose of injuring any place in Oregon, but its sole object is to aid in the development of the entire state, and the improving of traffic conditions in all parts of it. It believes that whatever benefits one part of the state benefits in some degree the whole commonwealth. The league, however, recognizes that everything cannot be accomplished at once and it has taken up the opening of a large deep sea harbor on the coast as being the one thing of more benefit to the entire state than any other. The league believes that this is of just as much importance to the country east of the Cascades as to the Willamette, and its adjacent valleys. It will give an outlet to the products of the valley, and it will in the near future result in a railroad across the Cascades, bringing the two sections in close touch with each other and benefiting both. It will give the great inland empire of Crook, Klamath, Harney, Lake, Malheur and Grant counties as well as Northern Nevada a short and direct outlet to the ocean, and put it in touch with the commerce of the world. It will give this vast section, now practically shut out of the markets of the world by the high cost of transportation, a short line of communication, with reasonable rates. It is absolutely necessary to the section across the mountains that this railroad communication be given it, and the league believes its present efforts will accomplish this. The valley and the coast range needs this additional outlet, but its needs are mild compared to those of the great country across the Cascades. To the valley it is an aid, to the inland empire a vital necessity. This is not inimical to Portland, but is of direct benefit to it. San Francisco is reaching with greedy hands for the trade of all central and southern Oregon, and unless this trade can be diverted to some more direct point, neither the valley nor Portland will be benefited by the tremendous growth that transportation facilities and irrigation will cause. Eastern Oregon should stir itself to assist in the good work, and a development league, on that side of the range, working in harmony and union

with the valley league will do much to work out its speedier salvation.

A glance at the map will show how utterly inadequate the railroads are to the needs of the country. The Southern Pacific passes through the state, paralleling the coast line at a distance of about 50 miles. The O. R. & N. and other roads follow nearly the length of its northern border, while the O. R. & N. extends down the eastern border nearly half way. The state has a railroad fence around it. And from the north two little bars run down from the main wire, a distance of about 50 miles. Here in Oregon alone is an area 200 by 300 miles without a railroad. Every interest of the state demands its exploitation. The league proposes aiding this great work in every way in its power and at all times, with Portland's aid, if it can get it, but without it if compelled to do so. It may be added that the league will do all in its power to aid Portland in its efforts to secure a better channel to the sea, as it will aid every other section of the state to the utmost of its ability. It is all for Oregon and for all of Oregon.

THE NEXT STATE ELECTION.

Next June the people of Oregon will select an entire new board of state officials and county officials and a legislature.

Referring to the state officials, the present governor, a Democrat, elected by Republicans, is liable to be renominated.

The state printer, state attorney, state superintendent of schools and state labor commissioner are up for re-election.

So far not much opposition has appeared to any of these officials. They are looked upon as giving the people good and faithful service.

For state printer the names of Willis Dunnaway and William J. Clarke have appeared in the papers and they have many friends.

J. B. Whitney, the present state printer, is not opposing any of the proposed reforms, such as putting him on a flat salary or state ownership.

The promotion of Justice Wolverton to the federal judgeship makes a place on the ticket for an eastern Oregon man for his place.

The man generally spoken of for the supreme judgeship is Robert E. Eakin of Union county, circuit judge for the past eight years.

He had an extensive practice and was first elected in a Democratic district, is 55 years old and well qualified to go higher.

For governor James Withycombe and C. A. Johns are prominent candidates, with T. T. Geer, E. L. Smith and H. E. Ankeny mentioned.

It is conceded that it will require a man of great energy, resources and ability as a campaigner to be elected over Chamberlain.

The campaign required to secure a nomination under the direct primary law is not fully appreciated by many of the aspirants.

To go over a state twice as large as Illinois and very thinly populated outside of the northwest portion takes time, money and energy.

Aspirants must have a very wide personal acquaintance, or use the newspapers freely or circularize the voters direct.

For treasurer there as yet no names prominently before the people. Ralph Hoyt of the Merchants National bank of Portland, and J. H. Aitken of the Oregon Commercial Co., Huntington, are mentioned.

For secretary of state Marion county has three candidates, according to newspaper reports, Calud Gateh, Lot L. Pearce and F. T. Wrightman. The latter gentleman has taken the public into his confidence on the subject of raising state revenues without levying a direct tax on property. His views are set forth in this number.

CANDIDATES GOING SOME.

It is but natural that at all large gatherings the candidates for state offices should put in an appearance.

It is true that many of them have no message for the people but the word DESIRE strongly underscored across their forehead.

At the good roads convention nearly all the political aspirants on both sides got to the front.

The Corvallis Gazette reported all the nice things about all three aspirants and then has the following:

"Judge Webster of Multnomah county was the first introduced. He displayed his ability to make things amusing, relating some amusing incidents about ex-Governor Geer.
