THE LATE SENATOR MITCHELL.

Today the poor tenement that held the soul of Oregon's late senator was laid away in Riverview cemetery with simple yet befitting ceremonies. The little mound of freshly-heaped earth covers forever from sight the features known to almost every Oregonian. The strong form, the kindly face, the winning smile, that stole into one's friendship will be seen no more of men. The hands lie folded and silent, the eloquent lips and musical tongue no more shall move to laughter or to tears, or sway the minds of men. The grass will cover the mound beneath which he sleeps with verdure, and an unpretentious shaft will tell the tale—he was—. Yet thousands there he in Oregon, who will keep as fresh and green as the grass above his grave the memory of generous deeds, of kindly words, of friendly aid, of prompt response in time of trouble. He has assisted in making much of the history of Oregon, and by that record he will be judged by those who come after us, more justly, and, perhaps, more leniently and generously than by the present generation.

He had many of the elements of greatness, and was undoubtedly the peer, intellectually, of any of his contemporaries. Of great energy, tireless and persistent, he labored always for Oregon's advancement, and he labored not in vain. From appropriations amounting to millions for the whole state, to the plea of the homesteader, whose little home was jeopardized by the encroachment of railroads, or threatened by land grabbers, or the old veteran or his widowed mate, he devoted alike his time and talents. No appeal was ever made to him that did not receive consideration and response, and in many a humble Oregon home, alike in the big forests of Western Oregon and the rolling prairies of the Inland Empire, there are those who mourn the loss of a true friend.

His passing is pathetic. There in the little city where more than forty years of his life had been passed—which he had seen grow from a country village to the metropolis of the Northwest, the end came suddenly and unexpected. While the fairy creation at Gull's Lake, which his efforts did so much to create, was attracting the attention of the world, suddenly, as a bolt from the sky, came the charge that he had been using the office he had so long filled for private gain. That he had accepted the pitiful sum of \$2000, which the law says he should not have taken. Proud, sensitive, he held himself aloof from his old associates, and the pity of it, they permitted him to do so. Oregon rejoiced, he alone took no part in it. Others were honored, but for him there was the bitterness of death. Guilty or innocent matters not now, since the mortal is beyond the reach of praise or blame, and the spirit is with Him who gave it. In the height of his power and fame, he was not awayed by pride, and in the hour of his humiliation he bore himself manfully and uncomplainingly, finding no fault and making no recriminations. With those who were near and dear to him, almost at the other side of the world, life's evening faded into darkness, and "Death touched him with his fingers, and he slept."

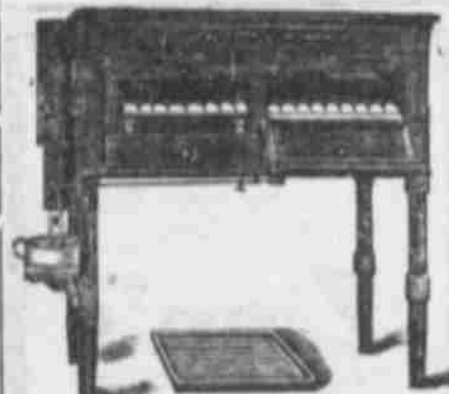
