ABUSES OF COLD STORAGE

The immediate environment of such large cities as New York and Philadelphia is simply a complex of smaller cities, and in the case of New York one can say that from the colossal metropolis to Albany in one direction, along both sides of the banks of the Hudson, from New York to Boston, along the coast in a northerly direction and from New York to Philadelphia in a southerly direction, we simply have a chain of larger and smaller cities, with insufficient agricultural land intervening to supply the animal and vegetable food for the multitude of human beings within the great cities. Cold storage has therefore become a necessity in order to preserve the large number of killed poultry that comes chiefly from the great west. There can be, therefore, no question of abolition of cold storage for animal food. In fact, some goods, like beef, mutton, etc., are improved and rendered more digestible by cold storage. This is due to the fact that the carcasses of slaughtered beves are not preserved in their entirety, and not until the viscera and entrails have been removed. Poultry, game and fish, although preserved in ice, will undergo a slow putrefaction change; the muscular part of the animal gradually becomes soaked with toxic substances. If the animal is taken out of cold storage very few moments suffice for a rapid absorption of toxins by the muscular part of the poultry or fish, as the case may be. A law should be enforced in the large cities prohibiting the cold storage of poultry, game and fish still containing the viscera and intestines.—Dietetic and Hygienic Gazette.
