Strengthening New York's Defenses.
 Washington, D. C., Dec. 13.—The quartermaster general of the army has provided for important contract work at Fort Totten, New York. This work includes repairs to the building now used by the electrician sergeants attached to the School of Submarine Defense. Considerable interest is taken by the artillery officers in that institution, for which it is desired to obtain at the present session of congress a liberal appropriation. An effort will be made by the chief of artillery to accomplish this when he appears before the house and senate military committees in regard to the army bill. The disposition of congress is to do little for the establishment at Fort Totten, not because there is any feeling that the school of submarine defence is not a valuable part of the artillery system of education, but it is realized there is necessity for economy in the military establishment, and the school at Fort Totten will be restricted in its development accordingly.

Openings in the Civil Service.
 Brooklyn, N. Y., Dec. 13.—The United States civil service commission is holding an examination here today to secure eligibles from which to make certification to fill vacancies as they may occur in the position of topographic draughtsman in any branch of the service. A large number of applicants is taking part in the examination. The supply of eligibles for this position has never been equal to the demand. Two days of seven hours each are allowed for this examination. There will be tests in drawing and lettering and mathematics, including arithmetic, algebra, including problems involving quadratics, plane and solid geometry, plane trigonometry, logarithms, mensuration and projections. This examination is open to all citizens of the United States of 20 years of age who comply with the requirements.

Boston, Mass., Dec. 13.—An examiner of china and glass ware is wanted at the appraiser's department in the Boston custom house at an annual salary of \$1200. To fill the position the civil service commission is holding an examination of candidates today. Only a few applicants have entered their name for this examination.

Florida Confederates Hold Reunion.
 Jacksonville, Fla., Dec. 13.—According to a conservative estimate there are between 2000 and 3000 members of the Florida State division United Confederate veterans and other visitors from different parts of the state in this city to attend the annual reunion of the Florida division U. C. V., which opens here today. The city is in holiday attire and all public buildings as well as many business houses and private residences are decorated with flags in honor of the veterans. The local veterans and the citizens in general have made every effort to make this reunion the most interesting and successful ever held in this state and have prepared an elaborate program for the entertainment of the visiting veterans. One of the principal features of the reunion will be a grand parade, in which the old captured Confederate flags, once carried by Florida troops during the civil war and recently returned to the state, will be displayed.
