PATENT DOPE UNDER BAN

Medicines Containing Alcohol Cannot be Sold at Retail.

Patent medicines containing alcohol must not be sold by druggists unless they have first secured a regular season license, according to a circular just issued by the internal revenue department. The circular is as follows:

Under date of November 24, 1905, the commissioner of internal revenue instructs me that by reason of the care given in the analysis of alcoholic compounds labeled as medicine and held out to the public as remedies for diseases, he has been unable to complete the examination of all such compounds now on the market; that the analysis of the following preparations have been completed and they are within the terms of the ruling of September 12, 1905:

Since the ruling referred to was made manufacturers of preparations referred to in that ruling, and wholesale druggists handling them have demonstrated that large losses will accrue to them if the ruling was made effective on Dec. 1, 1905. After a careful consideration of this phase of the case and to protect those who in good faith have engaged in the sale of these preparations, this office has determined to make the order effective as against manufacturers on January 1, 1906.

With regard to all handling these preparations as retail dealers, both druggists and other merchants, the order will be made effective on April 1, 1906.

The internal revenue office will continue to make analysis of other preparations similar to those named above and will announce from time to time the conclusions that they have reached.

Until public notice is given of others than those above named, manufacturers of the same, druggists and others using and selling these preparations will not be held liable for the special tax for any other articles than those set forth herein, provided that the compounds are sold in good faith as medicines.

As the ruling of the commissioner under date of September 12, 1905, has caused much injury, this office deems it to the public interest that as wide publicity as possible, through the public press, of the present status of this ruling shall be given.

As no manufacturer of the above listed preparations live or manufacture in this district it will not become effective on January 1, 1906, as to them and as to the retail dealers, are given until April 1, 1906, before the tax becomes due, no change in the present proposition of the dealers becoming tax payers is effective until that time.
