Woman Finds The Dalles.

The Dalles had a queer visitor the early part of the week in the person of a woman about 25 or 30 years of age whose name is Mrs. Lizzie Reiner. She came from Portland Friday and put up at the Hotel Albert. She was a fine looking woman and well dressed, but her actions aroused the suspicions of the host. Though apparently well educated and sane at times, she seemed to be afraid of some one killing her, and told Mr. Logans that if they broke into her room she had a pistol she'd kill them with. Fearing she might injure herself, Sunday evening while she was at supper he called Sheriff Sexton, who searched her room, but found nothing of the kind.

In the meantime she had made herself "numerous" at the Methodist church, which she attended in the morning and remaining after service told Rev. Luce that God had sent her here for a purpose, and attempted to tell him how to run his meeting. In class meeting she made the statement that there never was such a good woman in the world as she was and that her soul was expanding every day.

Realizing that she must be insane, Rev. Luce attempted to find out who she was, but she refused to enlighten him. In the evening she again created a scene during the services by her antics at the altar.

Monday morning learning her address in Portland, Sheriff Sexton telephoned to the police in that city asking him to investigate and see if any such person was missing. In about an hour he received an answer that Mrs. Lizzie Reiner, who had been a patient in a private sanitarium, had escaped from her friends and that an officer would be sent up to get her. He arrived that night and Tuesday returned with her.

The woman had formerly been a teacher near Dufur, where she boarded at the Shuster home, and Monday decided to go out there to visit friends. The sheriff requested Mrs. Logans to take her out walking in the afternoon so that she would miss the train. This was done, and when she returned and found the train had gone, seemed greatly disappointed.

Later in the evening she handed one of the girls her purse, saying she was going down to the river, and if she didn't come back the girl might keep the money. By strategy they prevented her leaving the hotel and kept a watch on her until the officer arrived.

The woman, it seems, was at home from the sanitarium for a short visit and evading her people went over to Vancouver and took the boat for this city, to which place she said God had called her.

The woman comes from a good family in Portland, and her husband is in business there.—The Dalles Chronicle.

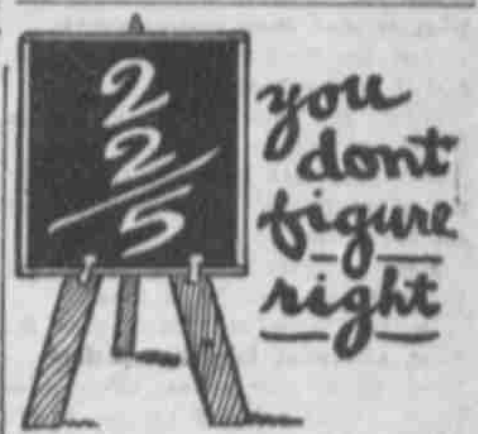
