**LOOKING AT THEIR PROPERTY**

Traveling in a special private car, the president and other head officials of the Pacific States Telephone and Telegraph Company, arrived in Salem yesterday, and spent several hours in looking over their property here, and the city in general. The party, which is on a general inspection tour of the Northwest cities, consists of H. W. Scott, the new president of the company, who was elected to take the place of John I. Sabin, deceased; Lewis Glass, vice-president and general manager; A. J. Steis, assistant to the president; P. W. Allison, chief engineer, and H. D. Pillsbury, general counsel.

Mr. Dancy, the local manager, showed them about the city in a carriage, and they expressed themselves as being pleased with the condition of their property, and delighted with the city.

They did not express themselves definitely as to whether there would be any change in the policy toward their patrons in Salem, but Mr. Dancy thinks that they will adopt a very liberal policy. Their car was attached to the early morning overland, and their next stop will be at Baker City. From there they will go to Walla Walla and Spokane, thence to Seattle and back to Portland.

Washington, Jan. 24.—The first test of strength came in the vote on the previous question after Daltzell presented a privileged report consisting of a rule providing for debate on the statehood bill shall continue until 3 p. m. Thursday. At that time it will be reported to the house, whereupon immediately, without debate, intervening motion or appeal, a vote shall be taken on the bill as to its final passage. The previous question was sustained by a vote of 192 to 165.
