This paper is not presenting Mr. Bourne's candidacy for the U. S. senate. He is a man who can present himself and is doing so in a very energetic manner. He needs no lame defence from anyone, and is able to take care of himself. He is addressing circulars and postal cards to all the voters of Oregon at his own expense.

Under the primary elections law many aspirants may seek their party's nomination for U. S. senator, just as they may for governor or any other office, but at the primary election in April from these aspirants only one will be chosen by each party as its candidate for the June election; so that on the official ballot at the June election there can be only one Republican and one Democrat, who was nominated at the primary election, one Socialist and one Prohibitionist, by convention, assembly or petition, for United States senator, though there may be as many independent candidates as wish to run, just as there may be for governor or any other office.

This campaign is not for men, but for the establishment of a principle, viz: That the people by their direct votes shall hereafter choose the U. S. senators from Oregon. That is the issue. Arrayed in opposition to it are all the special privilege class, all the corporations that profit by graft, as well as bosses and hostile politicians who find it cheaper and less dangerous to themselves to buy venal legislators than it is for them to be honest and trust to the people for justice.
