PEOPLE OF BABYLON

The high attainment in the arts of the Babylonians was shown by many pictures. They were excellent draughtsmen, as is seen, above all, in their representations of animals. They invented enameling and colored their alabaster sculpture. Extraordinary specimens in brilliant colors of the enameled tile work were shown. A sample of their knowledge of mechanics was seen in the representation of the removal of a colossal stone winged bull.

Professor Delitzsch used many of these pictures to show that many modern or mediæval traditions come from the Assyrians and Babylonians. A king fighting a very lively griffin, as pointed out, suggested the Archangel Michael or St. George and the dragon. The serpents twining around

a wand were carved in Babylon ages before Greece dreamed of Hermes. A remarkable compound beast, a serpent with forelegs like an ostrich, the hind legs of a panther and a scorpion at the end of its tail, recalled the Greek and old testament myths. A lifelike clay figurine of the devil was recognized without explanation by the audience, which came near applauding, and was followed by a very angel like woman with wings.

The accuracy of the Babylonian and Chaldean astronomical calculations are astonishing. We moderns are still living in their teachings in astronomy and mathematics. They had the decimal system. They divided the hour into sixty minutes, and the circle into 360 degrees. They devised the twelve signs of the zodiac, and the seven days of the week, with their pagan names that no religion has succeeded in modifying—Sunday, Monday, etc.

The Chaldean magic and astrology passed to Egypt and to Greece, and has come to our times. Melancthon believed in the influence of the stars; Koppler, the astronomer, drew a horoscope for Wallenstein, and even Leibnitz was bused with alchemy. The long stay of the Jews in Babylon and the settlement of Samaria and other portions of Palestine by Babylonians explains how so many Babylonian ideas entered into the minds of the Jews of the new testament time—for instance, the belief in demons.

Many religious ideas that we ascribe to the old testament existed much earlier in Babylon, and are found in these records. Plenty of Bible phrases occur word for word in the legal documents. We find in Babylon God appearing in a dream, or interfering in person, or speaking to man. We find prophets, and the legend that man was made of clay, moistened by the sweat of the Maker. We find the conception of life after death nobler than the Hebrew view, and ideas of a hell of drought and a paradise of waters.

Professor Delitzsch was very severe on Herodotus for the wrong ideas he has spread about Babylon. He was rather cold about the Hebrew versions, too. He referred to the excavations that are going on—English, French, and particularly the American at Nippur and the German at Assur and Babylon. He asserted that in something over 20 years the whole site of Babylon could be excavated. He wound up with an appeal for sympathy and support for the work the excavators have undertaken.—New York Sun report of Professor Delitzsch's lecture.

Editor Journal: Thinking perhaps a few items from this place would interest your Salem readers, of not yourself, I will attempt to enlighten them in a small way.

We are having fine weather here—have had but two or three days of rain since my arrival (December 22). Business is not so brisk as in Salem except, perhaps, in the liquor business. When I first came here I attempted to count the saloons, but gave the job up—I counted up to 14 and quit. I was told that every hotel and many of the groceries had a bar attached, so that there must be more than 20 or 25 places besides the drug stores where "booze" is dispensed. Otherwise it is a very pleasant little city.

There are few soldiers here at present, the most of them having been sent to the Philippines lately, but they expect to fill the barracks in a short time, probably next month.

A great many fish are caught in the bay—principally salmon and rock cod—and shipped to San Francisco. The fishermen are mostly Japanese, hired by the shippers.

I saw a star fish and a couple of what I supposed to be devil fish the other day; at least they filled the descriptions I have read of them. They had a large head in the center and a dozen or more tentacles surrounding them. They were anything but beautiful, to say the best of them.

Quite an unusual episode occurred here Monday night and yesterday, which would have been amusing if it were not so sorrowful. Lady K. Lawson of London, England, arrived on the Monday evening train and called from the depot to a street car in grand style and registered at a hotel. But her ladyship's room was not satisfactory so she began to abuse every one who came in her way. An officer arrested her for being drunk and disorderly and she appeared before a justice of the peace yesterday morning. The case was dismissed, but she was rearrested and spent the night in the lockup. There are other particulars of the case, but I have not time or space to give them.
