The state library commission met yesterday afternoon. All the members of the board were present. Miss Marvin made the announcement that his private business, which is a sure Hon. W. B. Ayre had made a gift of \$500 for the use of the commission to provide circulating libraries for various towns throughout the state. Mr. Ayre made a similar gift for the same cause some time ago. The board considered the bids from publishing houses to supply school libraries with books purchased under the 10-cent Hand effective campaign and reports brary law. All the bids were rejected, and a call was issued for March 5th, at which time new bids are to be submitted, conforming with the regulations of the board.
