H. M. Cake of Portland has come out for the U. S. senate. He is a lawyer of ability and president of the commercial club. He proposes to secure the nomination under the odious direct primary law that so many are kicking about, and then get his name on the Australian ballot as the regular Republican candidate if he can, and get the election by the direct vote of the people. If he gets that election, why should any member of the legislature refuse to ratify it? With Fred W. Mulkey running for the short term and H. M. Cake running for the long term, who can object to subscribing to the law and abiding by it if those gentlemen win? If Jonathan Bourne is as bad a man as some of his critics say he is, there can be no danger of his getting the nomination over a man like Cake, to whom there can be no reasonable objection. That would seem to remove all objection to direct election of U. S. senators by the vote of the people of Oregon. It is to be hoped there may still be other aspirants for the senatorship besides Cake, Bourne and Mulkey.

Senator Charles W. Fulton is doing good work for Oregon at Washington. He has dispelled the illusion that a young man in his prime cannot build up influence and become potentially useful to Oregon. Let it also be said that Senator Fulton informs his friends that when he comes up for re-election he will go before the people and ask the office at their hands on the popular vote plan, and if they do not endorse his record as a senator he will not ask the office for a second term. So that Oregon seems to be on the verge of settling the long contested question of electing senators by the popular choice plan. The aspirants for the new senatorships are going before the people. The present senator will come up for re-election on the people's choice plan. It will be just as well, if the Republican papers quit jumping onto the man who takes Judge No. 1, and for all Republican newspapers to allow candidates some latitude in interpreting the law. The tendency is toward accepting the law and giving it fair and effective interpretation.

The best known man in western Oregon and the most popular man in the Republican party in this part of the state is James Withycombe of Corvallis. He is the people's candidate for governor in the republican party, having shown no disposition to cater or bow down to the bosses, or any faction. He is a man of the people and strong with the people. For the past week he has been holding farmers' institutes in Jackson county and early in March there is to be a farmers' institute held at Salem. has been doing for the past ten years, and his work has done more to build up the cause of agriculture and stock raising and dairying and fruit growing than any other one agency connected with the agricultural college. He has made it practical and useful and valuable to the farmers of the state, and if they want a man who represents the interests of agriculture nominated for governor it is up to them to elect him. Too much cannot be said for Dr. Withycombe's private life. He has been a model citizen in all ways and especially as an example of industry and devotion to his calling and as an independent self sustaining citizen, who seeks the office for the honor but who is no way dependent on politics for a living.

Plant flowers. Salem can be made the flower city of western Oregon with a very little effort. Portland desires to be the Rose City. That is all right. But let us go a step farther and be the Flower City of Oregon. The most beautiful flowers can be grown in our soils and climate by the use of the hoe and a little water. Not only roses but all kinds of lilies, bulbous plants, shrubs, annuals and biennials and perennials. Poppies, peonies, and all the old fashioned flowers, and the gladiolus can be produced with very little effort and if this city would send a wagon load each day to the overland trains it would be advertising all over the world as the flower city of the west. There are many beautiful flowering shrubs that should be planted and cut down the unsightly maple trees that hide the beauty of our city. Planting flowers would give employment to scores of gardeners and would distribute money and add to the enjoyment of everyone. Improved streets, plenty of flowers, and the use of water on the streets, would make this the city beautiful.

The Salem school board is again borrowing money for current expenses, and the clerk is authorized to borrow on the best terms. Why not throw the proposition open to all citizens alike? A two-bit ad would do it and let the district have the use of the cheapest money it can get. If private citizens are willing to let the district have money at four or five per cent, why pay a bank six or eight? It is a good thing for the bank to give it the preference, but as the public schools are a matter of importance to all the people, why not get the cheapest money and let the taxpayer have the benefit? The popular loan plan gave this school district the use of money at four per cent, but that plan has not been given much chance of late and it is time it were resumed. If the people all have notice, and if the matter is made convenient for them, they will furnish all the money the district needs at four per cent. We do not believe this matter should be overlooked or neglected, for when teachers are being paid as low salaries as they are at Salem there should be no such thing as excessive generosity to the money lenders.

A Tillamook Townsite.
Scott Boerth, a former resident of Salem but now of Portland, is the secretary of a company which has taken steps to develop a large townsite on Tillamook Bay. The movement is backed by a bond issue of \$100,000 by the Bay City Land company.

It seems that the company has executed a trust deed conveying a large portion of the townsite of Bay City, situated on Tillamook Bay, and seven miles from Tillamook City. The company will offer special inducements to settlers and industries and foster the development of that section of Oregon by all legitimate methods.

Secretary Boerth will devote his entire attention to the details of the work at the townsite.
