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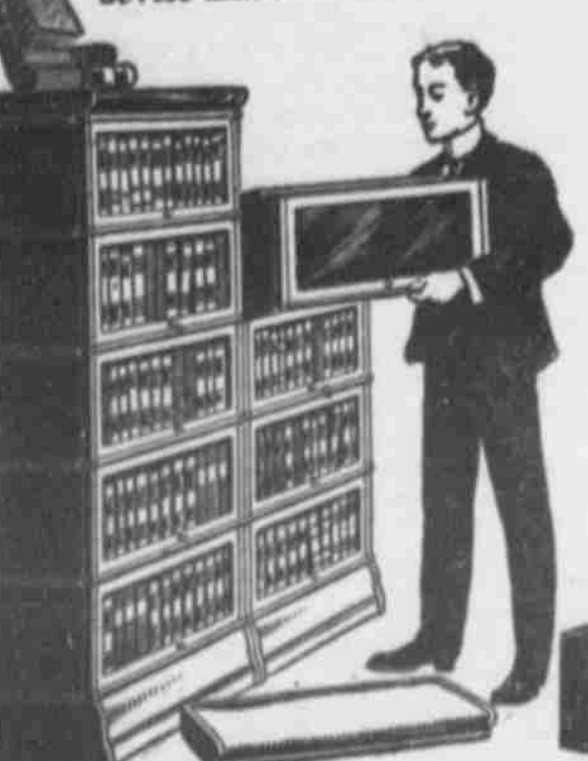

State News

There has been a valuable coal discovery made at Hay Creek, Eastern Oregon.

Colonel Reuben E. Maury, one of Jackson county's oldest and most respected citizens, died at his home near Jacksonville last week.

The sheep market in Eastern Oregon is already quite brisk. All the notable sheep of Wasco, Crook, and Wheeler counties are contracted for, and at good figures.

Miss Edna Campbell, of Lyle, Wash., is the youngest state grange secretary in the United States, having been elected to that position by the Washington state grange last June. She has in her jurisdiction over 75 granges.

The Dean normal basket ball teams of boys and girls played against the Roseburg high school respective teams Thursday evening, and in speaking of the game, the Roseburg Review says it was a "fuss for all" rough house, in which players, referees and spectators took part. Bitter feeling exists between the two teams and in the first of the game the roughing began. Fights and slugging were much in evidence, and in the mix-up one man had his neck badly sprained. The final score of the two teams were boys, 12 to 7, and girls 21 to 13, in favor of the Roseburgs.

Chauncey Yepp, a well known conductor of the Conductor of the Corvallis & Eastern railroad, came near losing his life in the waters of Yaquina bay Thursday as the result of an accident. He was assisting some men with a pile driver, and slipped

on the wet boards and fell into the bay. He had heavy boots and clothes on, and was unable to help himself, and had not help reached him immediately he would have lost his life.
