**DIRECT
PRIMARY
LAW****Analyzed by One of the Valley
Republican Papers**

(Daily Eugene Register.)

"I further state to the people of Oregon as well as to the people of my legislative district, that during my term of office I will always vote for that candidate for United States senator in congress **WHO HAS RECEIVED THE HIGHEST NUMBER OF THE PEOPLE'S VOTES FOR THAT POSITION AT THE GENERAL ELECTION NEXT PRECEDING THE ELECTION OF A SENATOR** in congress without regard to my individual preference."

The above is the wording of the famous "Statement No. 1" which is being interpreted in so many different ways by the press of Oregon. The black faced type is used to bring out the all important point of controversy and it seems there can be but one correct interpretation. There will be two candidates' names on the ballot next June, one Republican and one Democrat. If the Democrat receives the greatest number of votes at this election, the candidate who has signed statement No. 1 is committed to vote for him and if the Republican receives the largest vote, the legislator should vote for him. Political faith cuts no figure with a man's action in voting for a senator if he stands for the statement and carries out his agreement.

The great majority of the Democratic press in Oregon are very insistent that candidates sign the statement, for that party has an ax to grind. The law was not intended to deprive either party of a choice for senator, if it has a majority of senators and representatives but in the form in which it reached the statutes, this view is the only proper one to take. If the people vote for either a Democrat or Republican, that man is entitled to become U. S. senator, according to the spirit of the primary law.

There is quite a general belief that the vote at the primary is to settle the senatorial question; that in case there is but one Democratic candidate, and a large number of Republican candidates and the Democrat obtains more votes than any of the Republicans, he would be the one who should be elected by the legislature. directly wrong, as may be seen by referring to the text of the statement. The Democrat with the highest number of votes and the Republican having the most votes at the primary election will be entitled to have their names on the their party ballots to be voted at the general election in June.

This is a matter of concern to most candidates for the legislature. Some believe they will obtain more votes by signing the statement without qualifications, while others think the provision should be added that they will vote for the man of their party who has the highest vote. And so the state will have legislative candidates with both beliefs.

This is a matter for every candidate to decide for himself, and after he decides it, he will learn at the primaries what the general run of voters desire regarding the statement. Until that time there is no way of learning how they stand, and as a matter of fact many are as yet undecided.

Personally, the Register is of the opinion that the man who signs the statement will lose some of the votes from strict and unswerving party men, and on the other hand we judge it is a logical conclusion that those who do not sign it, and those who qualify when signing, will lose votes as well. So it appears the candidate is up against it whichever way he jumps.

It may be interesting to candidates to know that over 12,000 Oregon voters have already pledged themselves not to vote for candidates who do not sign, and that this number is expected to exceed 25,000 before the date of the primaries.
