ELECTION DATES TO REMEMBER.

Registration books for primary election close April 10.
Primary election April 20.
Registration books again opened April 25 and close May 15.
Last day for filing names for state and district offices March 30.
Last day for filing names for county offices April 4.
Canvassing votes for nominating state and district candidates May 5.
Last day for filing nominating petitions for county offices May 19.
Last day for filing certificates of nomination May 5.
General election June 4.

HOPE TO WIN BY CONFUSION.

The plutocratic organs that are opposed to the direct nomination and direct election of U. S. senators hope to defeat the primary law by misrepresentation and creating confusion.

THEY HAVE NOT TOLD THEIR READERS THE TRUTH ABOUT THE LAW and have constantly sought to establish the idea that the Republican vote is to be scattered among a number of aspirants, and the Democratic vote concentrated on one candidate.

THAT IS NOT THE TRUTH ABOUT THE LAW. As other offices are filled under the direct primary system, there may be many aspirants for the nomination, BUT THE ONE HAVING THE MOST VOTES OF REPUBLICANS BECOMES THE SOLE CANDIDATE OF THE REPUBLICAN PARTY.

This feature of the law is ably set forth by an editorial in the Independent West Side Enterprise, as follows, quoting the law itself:

There yet exists some confusion as to the meaning of statement No. 1 of the direct primary nominating law. It is merely a form of pledge taken by a legislative candidate promising to abide by the vote of the people on a candidate for the United States senate. The pledge does not refer to the vote at the primaries in April, as some would have the masses believe. IT IS NOT POSSIBLE FOR MORE THAN ONE TO RUN AS A REPUBLICAN NOR IS IT POSSIBLE FOR MORE THAN ONE TO RUN AS A DEMOCRAT. The campaign for the people's vote for a United States senator is on precisely the same basis as the campaign for governor, secretary of state or any other state office. The direct primary law is very explicit on this point. It says:

"Every political party and its regularly nominated candidates, members and officers, shall have the sole and exclusive right to the use of the party name and the whole thereof, and no candidate for office shall be permitted to use any word of the name of any other political party or organization than that by which he is nominated."

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NO INDEPENDENT OR NONPARTISAN CANDIDATE SHALL BE PERMITTED TO USE ANY WORD OF THE NAME OF ANY EXISTING POLITICAL PARTY OR ORGANIZATION IN HIS CANDIDACY. The names of candidates for public office nominated under the provisions of this law shall be printed on the official ballots for the ensuing election AS THE ONLY CANDIDATE OF THE RESPECTIVE POLITICAL PARTIES FOR SUCH PUBLIC OFFICE in like manner as the names of the candidates nominated by other methods are required to be printed on such official ballots, and the provisions of Sections 2805 and 2806 of Beallinger and Cotton's Annotated Codes and Statutes of Oregon shall apply to and are hereby made applicable to nominations for public office made under this law, so far as the same are not in conflict with the provisions of this law."

ROAD WILL BE BUILT.

The Willamette Valley Traction Co. has done right in deciding to go ahead and build their line to Portland, and leave it to the people whether a franchise shall be granted to let them into that city or not.

Capital that seeks to develop Oregon SHOULD NOT HAVE TO GO ON ITS KNEES to a lot of grafting city politicians, who are either owned by hostile influences or out for a price, or both.

The time is coming when the people, under the referendum, can put such matters to a vote and WILL NO LONGER BE COMPELLED TO DEAL WITH GRAFTING POLITICIANS AND GRASPING MONOPOLIES BEHIND THEM.

The people of Oregon love fair play and are united in demanding more and better transportation facilities throughout western Oregon.

All combinations to keep such improvements that will result in lower rates of fare and freight will in the end be overthrown.

IN JUNE THE CONSTITUTION WILL BE AMENDED so that local matters can be taken up under the initiative and referendum and disposed of.

That will be time enough to order the city council to grant a franchise.

NO MORE HOPFARD SALOONS.

The Salem Carpenters' Union has adopted resolutions asking the county court to grant no licenses for selling liquor in hop yards.

That there has been a great deal of liquor sold in the hop yards is a fact, and IN SOME YARDS THERE WAS ABUSE OF THIS KIND.

The crowds that come from Portland to work in hop yards are sometimes very disorderly, and of the rougher class.

With liquors sold in the hop yards, there is scarcely one of them allowing it that is fit for families and children to work in.

If liquor selling in the hop yards is not stopped, the better class of hop pickers will not seek that employment.

The next cry is to LET IN MORE CHINESE TO PICK THE HOPS, and it is a great menace to white labor to allow liquor selling to go on.

The sale of liquors in the hop yards is objectionable because it is not under any police control whatever.

The Carpenters' Union has struck a blow for a needed reform in this industry. Their demand should be heeded by the authorities.

ENFORCE THE GAME LAWS.

The state game warden has appointed a number of deputies to patrol the trout streams about Salem to arrest law violators.

The practice of some persons getting in before the first day of April and catching out all the best trout IS GOING TO COST SOME ONE DEARLY.

There is nothing more reprehensible, un-American, and hogwash than stripping a stream of all its fish before the season is open, because decent sportsmen will obey the law.

There is too much of that and the parties caught doing that this year should be made an example of no matter who they are. THAT KIND OF LAWLESSNESS DESERVES NO PROTECTION.

The Journal will give the fullest publicity to anyone caught violating the game laws, though it happens to be one of our oldest friends. The people who respect and obey laws are entitled to protection, and not the law breaker.

Let us have a square deal in the enforcement of the game laws.

Champion of Statement One

Jonathan Bourne, Jr., candidate before the Republican primaries for the nomination of United States senator in congress, for the long term, commencing March 4, 1907, was born in New Bedford, Mass., February 23, 1855, was a member of the class of 1877 at Harvard University; came to Portland May 10, 1878; was a Republican member of the Oregon legislature in the session of 1885, and the extra session of 1886; was one of Oregon's delegates to the Republican National Convention of 1888, and Oregon's member of the Republican National Committee from 1888 to 1892, and a delegate to the Republican National Convention of 1892, and was elected as a Mitchell Republican to the Oregon legislature in 1896.

Mr. Bourne has been more prominently identified with the development of the mineral resources of Oregon than any other man in the state, having expended in the last 20 years over \$1,000,000 of his own money in the acquisition and development of Oregon mines.

While Mr. Bourne has had his residence and main office in Portland since 1878, he has had another office at New Bedford, Mass., and has carried on the business of his father's estate since 1880, which makes him familiar with many of the large interests and leading men in the East. These qualifications, in conjunction with his energy, originality, executive ability and experience in business and political affairs pre-eminently qualify him for making an able and influential senator for the state of Oregon.

Mr. Bourne has always favored extending the direct power of the people over their government as far as possible. He was one of the leading spirits in the Initiative and Referendum movement from 1896 until it was approved by the voters at the June election in 1902. In 1904 he was a member of the executive committee of the Direct Primary Nomination League, and holds the same position with the People's Power League at this time. In all these movements he has been one of the few to guarantee the necessary expenses of preparing and proposing their measures to the people.

He says that the choice of United States senator should be by direct vote of the people, and that the legislature should be compelled to elect the man the people select. To accomplish this result, he is championing statement No. 1 of the primary elections law as the only method by which public opinion may be crystallized and made effective upon the legislature.

IN HIS PETITION FOR NOMINATION HE SAYS: IF I AM NOMINATED AND ELECTED I WILL, DURING MY TERM OF OFFICE, FAVOR:

- "REPUBLICAN POLITICS.
- "AMENDING NATIONAL CONSTITUTION FOR PEOPLE'S ELECTION OF UNITED STATES SENATORS.
- "PUBLICITY POLITICAL CAMPAIGN EXPENSES.
- "NATIONAL CONTROL OF CORPORATIONS IN INTERSTATE COMMERCE.
- "RIGID EXCLUSION OF ASIATIC COOLIE LABOR; GOOD WAGES MAKE GOOD CITIZENS.
- "LEGAL LIMITATION LABOR HOURS FOR SAFETY ON RAILROADS.
- "PARCELS POST, INCLUDING RURAL DELIVERY.
- "PURE FOOD LAWS.
- "LIBERAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR PANAMA CANAL, COAST DEFENSE, RIVER AND HARBOR IMPROVEMENTS, INCLUDING COLUMBIA, WILLAMETTE RIVERS, COOS, YAQUINA AND OTHER OREGON HARBORS, CELILO CANAL, GOVERNMENT CANAL AT OREGON CITY.
- "FAIR SHARE OF IRRIGATION FUND FOR OREGON.
- "LOYAL SUPPORT OF SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES.

- "ROOSEVELT FOR SECOND ELECTIVE TERM.

His candidacy will do much to popularize the direct primary system of choosing a senator by direct election. There are now four men in the race for senator: Bourne, Cake, Lowell and Smith.

There can certainly no longer be any reasonable objection to letting the people have their choice of such a fine lot of candidates and then making the legislature respect that choice.

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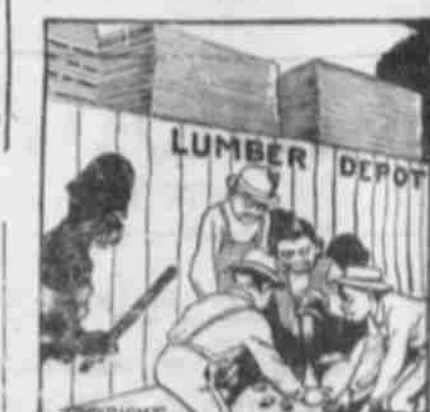
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
