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ELECTION DATES TO REMEMBER.

Registration books for primary election close April 10. Primary election April 20. Registration books again opened April 25 and close May 15. Last day for filing names for state and district offices March 30. Last day for filing names for county offices April 4. Canvassing votes for nominating state and district candidates May 5. Last day for filing nominating petitions for county offices May 10. Last day for filing certificates of nomination May 5. General election June 4.

The indications are that Oregon will hold down the whole normal school problem into one first-class state normal school located at Salem. This city has the model public school system of the state, and other advantages.

Salem is centrally located, has many higher institutions of learning, and is a fine home city. It could accommodate more normal school students than any other one city.

With a full twelve-grade public school system, employing the best teachers in the state, with a university, medical, law and divinity schools, students of a normal school would enjoy superior advantages.

Either this state will settle down to one normal school or the state might pay an institution something towards completing a normal school course by any student.

If the state is going to spend money to educate public school teachers why not pay every institution that turns out normal graduates?

This state requires five hundred new teachers every year in the public schools. Fifty dollars per capita would cost \$25000 a year, which is one-half what the state has been paying.

THREE MEN WITH A RECORD.

Three candidates for the legislature in Marion county (only eighteen had filed Saturday) have a record for standing by the choice of the people for the United States senate, Simmons, Davey and Judd.

Of these all three will probably be signed up for statement No. 1. Judd has not yet filed his declaration, but believes in the principle. SIMMONS WAS ONE OF THE FIRST TO SIGN STATEMENT NO. 1.

Davey, Simmons and Judd were Gov. men in the session before the last, and voted for the people's choice at that time to the end of the contest.

They could not well do otherwise than stand up for the principle which they contended for as right and which is expressed in statement No. 1.

JOHNS TALKS ABOUT HIS CANDIDACY.

Mayor Charles A. Johns, candidate for the Republican nomination for governor, returned home yesterday morning to look after business and professional matters. He will remain here for a few days. He will again start for the west side and probably remain there until the early part of next month.

Mr. Johns in speaking of the progress of his campaign said that to his eyes it could not look better. The strength of his following is growing every day. Sixty days ago he felt confident, thirty days ago sanguine and now he feels as certain that his ticket will be made as a man can be of anything that the future holds.

"I have visited many of the valley counties and gone into the southern counties to some extent," said he.

"I have everywhere met with cordiality and frankness, and now believe that I am in the best of positions to judge of the outcome. At no time have I considered that there was anyone on the race but Dr. Withycombe and myself, and I have, in my judgment, much the best of it so far as he is concerned. Though I have been at home but a few hours, I am informed by those with whom I have talked, that my candidacy at home and in the other eastern Oregon counties is in remarkably good

shape. With anything like the showing that I expect from east of the Cascades, there is the very best of reasons for my confidence. About other candidates for this office, these methods of endeavoring to reach the public ear, or the personalities they choose to indulge in I candidly tell you that I am saying nothing. With reference to other candidates for other offices I am equally reticent."

THE WEAKNESS OF INTOLERANCE

Rev. A. A. Morrison, of the Portland Episcopal church, has been delivering a series of lectures against Christian Science.

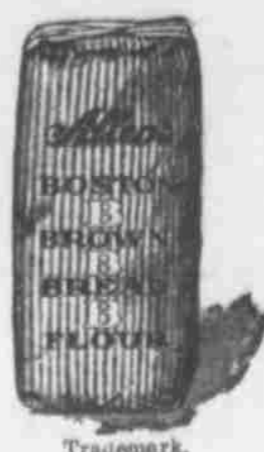
