New York, April 7 .- The merger of the Society of American Artists and the National Academy of Design hav ing heen definitely decided upon, prep. arations are now progressing to perfeet the joint organization. On the evening of Wedesday, April 11, the Society of American Artists will give a farewell dinner, to celebrate the morger. Now, that the merger is prantically insured, active stops will be taken to raise a fund of about \$3,000 .-000 for a united fine arts exhibition building, to house the dozen art socisties represented in the Fine Arts Federation.
