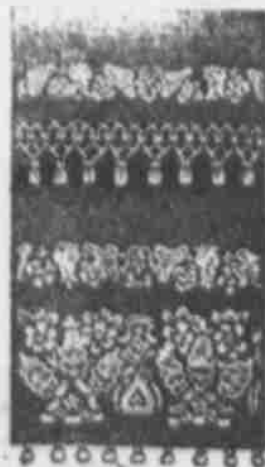

**Cruisers to Visit New York.**  
New York, April 7.—The navy de- partment has decided to send the ar- mored cruisers of the Atlantic fleet to the navy yard at Brooklyn, in ac- cordance with the recommendations of the board of construction. The first of these vessels will appear here for an overhauling at about the end of this month, and the others will reach the yard at intervals of two weeks. The orders are that work on each ship shall be limited to what may be done in 30 days, the idea being to have more than two of the cruisers at Brook- lyn at the same time. Other ships of the fleet will appear periodically at Brooklyn and will be docked and repaired in some cases and merely over- hauled in others, with a view to more extensive repairs in the fall.

The exhaustion of the fund for care and preservation under the construction and engineering bureaus had its effect on the volume of work which is plan- ned for the Brooklyn yard, but the bulk of repair work and most of the docking will necessarily be done here, although some of the work will be done at Norfolk.
