Grabbing Mineral Lands.

The latest move by the Southern Pacific company in its efforts to grab valuable mineral lands is against the Leets salt works in Churchill county.

The company has filed an application for a patent to the land upon which the Eagle salt works in Churchill county are situated, and if the company succeeds it will come into possession of one of the most valuable salt deposits in the state of Nevada.

The application for this patent was published by the Southern Pacific in the Lovelock Tribune, a weekly paper printed 75 miles distant from the salt deposits, the papers of that vicinity being carefully avoided. It was only by the merest chance that the Leets discovered that the company was after their property, and as soon as it became known a protest was lodged with the land office at Carson, before the registrar, of which a hearing will be held at an early date.

The case will be of interest, as it will involve the classification of saline deposits as mineral lands that are known to be mineral in character being reserved for the mining interests and exempt from railroad patent.

The salt works are the oldest in the state, having been opened in 1869 by B. F. Leets of Reno, who, with his sons, has been operating them ever since. Prior to that time salt was brought to Nevada by Indians from the coast or from the interior or at considerable expense. The opening up of the deposits in Churchill resulted in a material reduction of the price, and the property soon became one of great value.

A large part of the deposit is located upon one of the sections that was donated to the old Central Pacific company by congress during the period of the road's construction and until recently no effort was made by the land department of the Harriman corporation to dispossess the Leets. In keeping with the policy of attacking mining claims upon railroad land, however, application was made by the company for a patent to the land occupied by the salt works and the case will be fought out in the land office.

Under the laws of the country salt deposits upon public lands are subject to location and patent similar to mining claims.—Winnemucca Silver Star.

Inaugurating New President.

Austin, Texas, April 15.—The exercises connected with the inauguration of Dr. David Franklin Houston as president of the University of Texas, will open here this afternoon and will last two days. During those two days all work at the university will remain suspended and the institution will be thrown open to the inspection of the hundreds of representatives of colleges in all parts of the United States who are assembled here to take part in the celebration.

The exercises will begin this afternoon with a meeting of the college representatives for the purpose of discussing educational matters of importance. The discussion of the city school problem will be the principal feature of the afternoon session.

The inauguration proper will take place tomorrow. Governor Lanham will be present and will deliver a short address. Other addresses will be delivered by Chancellor James H. Kirkland of the Vanderbilt university, Pres-
