Roundhouse Burned.
Pendleton, Or., April 19.—It is reported here that the O. R. & N. roundhouse at Umatilla has been entirely destroyed by fire. Several engines were said to have been ruined in the flames but no loss of life is reported.

The flames spread so rapidly that the force of men in the yards could do but little. The loss will amount to several thousand dollars.

Among the locomotives destroyed was No. 913, the engine that ran into the rear end of the passenger train at Bridal Veil on February 6 last, causing loss of life and destruction of railroad property.

Seaside Mill Hands Beat Superintendent.
Seaside, Or., April 19.—Two men named Edward Anderson, father and son, are in the town jail, awaiting trial for assault on Superintendent Arthur Barr, of the Lumber mill. Young Anderson was discharged from the mill Monday, and, according to the story told by the employees of the lumber company, returned at 3 p. m. to get his pay. Assisted by his father, also employed in the establishment, it is alleged Anderson attacked Superintendent Barr when alone, using brass knuckles. The father, it is said, came behind Mr. Barr and struck him with a club, knocking him down. Both men then beat the prostrate Barr, breaking his nose and one of his ribs. R. H. Wright, who was working near, heard the struggle, and, with the assistance of men from the mill, rescued Barr from his assailants. Mr. Barr recently came to Seaside from the East with his family.
