MORE INDEPENDENT BENCH.

Would the Oregon supreme bench be more independent with one Democrat on it?

George W. Alger, who has won himself a place as one of the keenest critics of our American social and economic life, has a notable paper in the April Atlantic on Criminal Law Reform. Considering the delays and frustrations in criminal proceedings which have been so fruitful a source of lynchings and other wrongs in America, he points out that the chief causes of the delay and defeat of justice is the growing restriction placed upon the bench. American judges, he says, have much less independence of action than those of other countries, and that which they have is constantly growing less. This is one of the most serious questions of the time, and Mr. Alger's discussion of it merits the attention of all thoughtful readers.

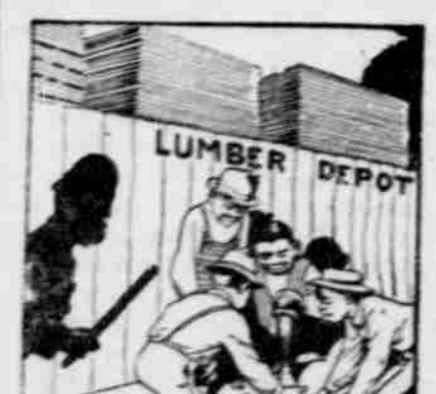
