## PORTLAND RESPONDS GENEROUSLY

Raises \$160,000 and Will Add Another \$100,000 or More if Necessary

The dispatches yesterday say: "San Francisco is more hopeful. The fire is controlled, the military are bringing order out of chaos, but an outbreak of smallpox in the concentration camps is threatened."

"Portland has already raised one hundred and fifty-nine thousand, three hundred and seventy-two dollars in money and supplies for the San Francisco sufferers and will contribute two hundred and fifty thousand dollars in all."

"Three train loads of refugees, penniless and destitute, will reach Portland this morning."
