Methodists May Change Church Ritual.

Birmingham, Ala., May 3.—The general conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church, South, opened here this morning with a large attendance of delegates from all parts of the south. This conference is of unusual importance, as some important changes in the church ritual will be proposed and thoroughly discussed. Among these changes are the following: To confer upon ordained ministers, who may have pastoral charges, the right to administer sacraments and to perform the marriage ceremony. To establish a department of home missions under the auspices of the general board of missions, with an assistant secretary in charge to be elected by the board. To secure a uniform system of lay representation in district conferences throughout the state; to ask that the general conference spend more money upon the Christian Advocate and to enlarge and improve that organ of the church. And, finally, to extend the pastors' time limit from four to eight years.

New Way to Make Glass.

Washington, May 3.—The United States vice consul at Nuremberg reports a new invention in the glass plate industry which, he believes, will bring about a revolution in the trade. It is the invention of M. Pourcellet, a Belgian, who has sold his patent to the European syndicate of plateglass manufacturers for nearly \$1,000,000. This syndicate consists of German, French and Belgian manufacturers, and one Bohemian factory. Hitherto, in the making of window glass, the molten substance has been blown into cylinders by glass-makers' pipes, and subsequently flattened, while in the making of plate glass the viscous mass was cast from the pots and rolled. The new invention draws the molten substance from the pot and conducts it between rollers lying side by side. The liquid mass cools on its way between the rows of rollers and comes out from them polished on both sides, in any desired thickness, this being regulated by the relative position of the rollers. The glass, after leaving the rollers, is beautifully polished and ready for use. At present dimensions of from 157.48 inches to 39.37 inches can be made, but experiments are being conducted to allow the manufacture of from 98.42 inches to 68.90 inches as well. One early result is expected to be that the manufacturing of plate glass of 157.48 inches and less will undergo an entire change, as the making of glass plates will come chiefly within the scope of the plate-glass furnaces.

discovered have been placed on view at the British museum. Foremost among them is a collection of three statues of Useresen III., who reigned about 2400 before Christ, representing the king at three different periods of his life, in youth, in middle age and as an old man, with sunken cheeks. The figures, which are of gray granite, measure a little over five feet in height and showing the king wearing the characteristic Egyptian apron, upon which is inscribed his name in hieroglyphics.

There is also a colossal limestone figure of Amenophis I., who reigned about 1700 before Christ, representing the king as the god Osiris, wearing the red and white crown, symbolizing upper and lower Egypt. On the back of the statue is a portion of an inscription, which reads: "Amenophis, beloved of Amen, Lord of the Thrones of the two Lands, giving Life."
