State News

The G. A. R. of Eugene will build a new hall in the near future.

The Hotel Gross of Eugene has been sold to two men recently from Kansas.

"Pappy" Funk, of Harrisburg, died at Albany last week of old age. He was well known throughout the valley.

The old Central House at Silverton, a landmark in that vicinity, is being remodeled, and it is understood that a new and modern building will be erected on the site.

Would be a Blessing to Thousands.

New York, May 7.—One of the most interesting features of the convention of the National Church Association for the Advancement of the Interests of Labor, which opened in session here today, will be the discussion of a gigantic plan, which has been suggested by Alexander Law, secretary of the St. Chrysostom's chapter, to do away with the tenement house evil. Bishop Potter, who was really the instigator of the idea upon which the plan is based, is the president of the national organization.

Mr. Law proposes that the city condemn and acquire property and build thereon municipally owned houses, to be occupied by citizens at low rents, just sufficient to pay the legal rate of interest on the cost of the property and its proper maintenance and that these houses be eventually sold to the tenants at cost price. If the plan is put into effect, it will eradicate, in the opinion of Mr. Law, the much condemned tenement houses, and will provide safe, sanitary habitations, with all modern improvements. He also suggests that the entire area of Long Island be incorporated within the city limits of Greater New York, for it seems evident to those who are fostering the plan that the trend of population is toward the eastern end of the island. It is generally conceded that Manhattan will eventually be the workshop and Long Island the home or sleeping place of the millions of people in the city. At the present rate of progress in transit facilities, it is estimated that it will not be long before Montauk Point will be within one hour's travel from the borough of Manhattan.

FREAK OF THE EARTHQUAKE.

Flow of Water From an Artesian Well Near Arlington Greatly Increased.

On the same day the earthquake did such terrible damage in California a slight shock was felt at Carley, on the north side of the Columbia, a few miles east of Arlington. There is an artesian well near the river that was struck while boring for oil about two years ago on the place of Mrs. Jennie Beardsley. Since Wednesday of last week that well has been spouting water ten feet in the air, and besides numerous springs of water are flowing in the vicinity, where no water was ever seen before.

Turns Over the Coin.

Sheriff Culver will make another turn-over of Marion county taxes to the county treasurer today. The amount is \$21,515.40, of which the city of Salem will get \$2941.51; Woodburn, \$164.49; Salem school district No. 24, \$2193.37.
