

FARMERS SHIPPERS CONGRESS

Will Cement the Bonds of Western and Southwestern Oregon

There is to be a great development convention May 23-24 down on Coos Bay—Farmers' and Shippers' congress, Farmers' institute and Development convention combined. The people of North Bend will prepare to entertain 2000 delegates and 5000 people. They are sending out thousands of invitations on venerated wood and there will be practically no limit to their hospitality. Nearly all the state and congressional candidates will be there.

Farmers' and Shippers' Congress. The fourth of the series of large and successful Farmers' and Shippers' congresses conducted by the Willamette Valley Development League will be held at North Bend, Coos county, Wednesday and Thursday, May 23 and 24. Transportation arrangements include reduced rates on the railroads to delegates, and the steamer Alliance will leave Portland Monday evening, May 21; leave Astoria Tuesday morning, May 22, arriving on Wednesday morning at Coos Bay. There will be two programs Wednesday at the pavilion, and on Thursday a free excursion to the delegates over the entire harbor, with a clam bake, barbecue and clam boil at noon, all free to the visitors. In the evening there will be a band concert, banquet and ball at the pavilion. The local committee hope to have a steamer leave Yaquina Bay and carry all delegates who will go from there. It is expected that many of the state candidates of both parties will attend this congress, as there will be at least 2000 guests from the communities about Coos Bay at the congress.

Beautiful wood-veneer invitations have been issued and will be out in a few days. Commercial clubs, mayors and newspaper men have been invited. It will be the greatest gathering ever held on Coos Bay.

The Salem Commercial Club will send a fine delegation, and all the principal towns in western Oregon will be represented. Program and transportation arrangements will be published in a few days.
