PLATFORM IS MADE

Initiative and Referendum, Direct Primary and Statement No. 1 Included: Republican State Central Committee Takes Advance Ground, Adopts Up-to-Date Platform.

The platform agreed upon by the Republican state central committee is given herewith:

Resolved, that the Republicans in Oregon, proud of the party's achievements and confident of its continued usefulness in the future, renew their enthusiasm in the faith and pledge each other to work in harmony and good fellowship with the single purpose of securing to the state and to the nation the perpetuation of the principles of Republicanism; and we congratulate our people on the happy cessation of the factional differences that have militated against Republican success in the past.

Resolved, that we reaffirm the principles of the national Republican platform adopted at Chicago, June 21, 1904, and congratulate the country upon the continuation of the era of prosperity that began under the wise and benevolent administration of public affairs by a Republican President and a Republican congress. It is a source of gratification to our people that our great industrial growth and our unequalled development of the resources of mine, farm and workshop since 1897 is due to the fact that the Republican party, with its policy of protection and its stand for a safe and honest monetary system, has exercised the functions of government. With its bright record of achievement, the Republican party expels a continuance of the non-factional heresies manifested in its policies and administration. We therefore call upon people of Oregon to give their support in the June election to the party of protection, progress and patriotism and willing to do things as Jonathan Bourne.

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Command the President.

Resolved, that President Roosevelt's administration of the affairs of the nation, at home and abroad, justifies the faith of the people in him as a wise and patriotic creature. We especially commend the steps taken by him to promote internal peace and contentment in the Philippines and to encourage the trade relations of our people with the several nations of the Orient. In his battle for civil righteousness he is entitled to the co-operation of all good citizens.

Resolved, that we heartily commend the principle embodied in the initiative and referendum amendment to the constitution. We urge the Republicans of Oregon to carefully consider all measures proposed thereto. This law, approved by two successive Republican legislatures and adopted by the citizens of this strongly Republican state, eliminates individual dictatorialism and brings back to the people the control of their political affairs.

Supports Direct Primary.

Resolved, that the first trial in Oregon of the direct primary law and Statement No. 1 recording the people's will in the choice of candidates for public office, and the Republican party claims the credit thereto. The nominees so chosen are men of integrity, courage and ability, who deserve and are entitled to receive the loyal, cordial and enthusiastic support of every Republican elector in the state.

Resolved, that the Republican party favors the investment of capital in improvements and enterprises in the state of Oregon with such regulation and control of corporations as will protect the rights and interests of the people.

Resolved, that the Republicans of Oregon favor just and equitable taxation of both tangible and intangible property, and are uniformly opposed to granting perpetual franchises.

Resolved, that we favor legislation that will require private banks, trust companies and savings banks to make true and accurate semi-annual reports of their financial condition similar to those required of national banks by the banking laws of the United States, to the end that the rights of the depositors and the people of the state with

Resolved, that we commend the efforts of our representatives in congress in securing appropriations for the rivers and harbors of our state, and we call attention to the necessity of securing further congressional aid for the removal of all barriers to the exchange of our mineral products with the markets of the world.

Resolved, that we pledge the nominees of the state Republican ticket to prevent, efficient and economical administration of the business of the state, and the enforcement of all laws upon the statute books.

Resolved, that we extend our sincere sympathy to the stricken people of our sister state of California and commend the prompt relief tendered them in the recent hour of calamity.

GREAT MILITARY AND NAVAL CELEBRATION

Armed and Naval of the World to Participate in the Jamestown Exposition at Hampton Roads.

The greatest naval and military exposition of the age will open its gates on the historic shores of Hampton Roads April 30, 1907. It will be known as the Jamestown Exposition, in honor of the first permanent settlement of English speaking people in America. Three centuries of important events will be commemorated in this history-making exposition. Every acre of land and water around the exposition grounds has played a part in the great drama of events from the arrival of the small vessels with their little company of English pioneers April 30, 1607, to the passing of the French and American fleets with the remains of the founders of the American navy, John Paul Jones, a few days ago.

The first English settlers, who founded Jamestown in 1607, and made the new territory of Virginia an English colony, influenced the destiny of America and saved it from the clutches of Spain, then the most powerful nation in the sea. The importance of the settlement of Jamestown is therefore apparent, and the great exposition now in progress of preparation will be a worthy celebration of an event of such magnitude and far-reaching influence.

In the trying times of the American revolution the country around where the exposition is located was a bloody battle ground, and at Yorktown, but a few miles away, the last great British army surrendered to the Americans and the decisive blow was dealt which gave independence to the American colonies.

During the bloody war between the states, when two opposing armies met in battle for the first time, it was in the harbor of Hampton Roads, just off the point where the exposition grounds are located. The fight between the Monitor and the Merrimac was singular in many ways than one and denotes the passing of the wooden ships and the establishment of the ironclads in the great navies of the world.

The important events which have transpired in this locality led to the selection of this historic ground as an international exposition in which the great navies and armies of the world could be brought together in friendly parades and maneuvers. The American Congress appropriated money for this grand affair and the President invited the nations of the world to participate in the Jamestown exposition. It will be primarily a military and naval exposition, on the most extensive scale ever undertaken in any country, but there will be numerous other features to give in all of the attractions peculiar to world's fairs and great industrial and commercial expositions.

National Baraca Convention.

Albany, N. Y., May 9.—The national baraca convention will open here this evening for a two days' session. The sessions will be held in the Tabernacle Baptist church and more than 300 delegates will be in attendance. Nearly all the delegates arrived here this morning and they will spend the afternoon in sight seeing. An educational meeting will be held at 7 o'clock to give the delegates an opportunity to become acquainted with each other. The first business session will begin at 8 o'clock this evening.

President R. N. Sims of North Carolina will preside and the program will open with devotional services, led by the Rev. J. V. Wemple, pastor of the Sixth Presbyterian church. M. A. Hudson, the national president of the organization, will deliver an address on the "Baraca Idea," and Robert Spear of New York will speak on "Young Men and Prayer."

At the session tomorrow morning President Hudson will occupy the chair and the Rev. E. R. Allen, pastor of the Hope Baptist church, will conduct the devotional service. Among the prominent speakers will be A. S. Hampton of Detroit, the Rev. J. Foster White of Watertown, N. Y., and William A. Kloppel of New York. There will also be sessions in the afternoon and evening.
