THE GOVERNMENT MODEL ROAD.

The American delegates of whom there is a large number, arrived in Boulogne-sur-Mer on May 11 and made a very pleasant and interesting trip through Switzerland and France before they came to Paris.

The Importance of Expert Gunnery.

London, May 16.—According to the deductions which the British naval experts have drawn from the Russo-Japanese naval campaign, and especially from the battle of Tsushima, it is highly probable that all great naval engagements of the future will be fought at long ranges. The importance of expert gunnery is, therefore, the first consideration.
